Wyoming State Fair Youth Livestock Shows Policies & Procedures

ALPACA - BEEF CATTLE - GOATS - HORSES - POULTRY - RABBITS - SHEEP - SWINE - WOOL

- Wyoming State Fair Management reserves the right to interpret all rules and arbitrarily settle all differences and questions not adequately addressed in this guide.
- 2. Rules and Regulations. Compliance with *General Rules and Regulations* apply. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to be familiar with all applicable rules and regulations. Read on page 8.
- 3. Health and Animal Welfare. All animals must meet Livestock Health and Welfare Requirements. Read on page 50.
- **4. Exhibitor Responsibility.** Wyoming State Fair will not be responsible for losses, injuries, or mishaps that may befall animals during the show. Reasonable precautions will be taken to prevent losses or injuries.
- 5. Exhibitor Eligibility. Bona-fide Wyoming 4-Hand Wyoming FFAmembers, in good standing, are eligible to enter and participate as a representative of their respective county 4-H program or FFA chapter. Youth must have exhibited/shown at their respective, and most recent, county fair. Separate 4-H and FFA Animal Entries. Per the June 2021 MOU between UWE 4-H and the Wyoming FFA Association, any youth enrolled in both organizations must identify each static exhibit or animal entered for competition as being a unique outcome of their FFA SAE or their 4-H project and enter the correct classes/divisions endorsed by the applicable organization.
- 6. Entry Process. Entries are completed by the members' respective FFA Advisor or 4-H Educator. Read on page 73.
- 7. Ownership. All livestock must be owned by the individual member by the following dates:

Market Beef - February 1;
Horses/Dogs - May 1;
Market Lambs, Swine, Goats, Poultry - June 1;
Meat Rabbits - 80 day rule (see page 92)
All Other Youth Livestock - June 1

- 8. Tagging/Identification. All market animals shown must be properly tagged with an approved 15-digit RFID ear tag. Market animals not having the proper RFID tags in place will not be eligible to show.
- 9. Youth Animal Fitting Policy: Exhibitors must be present for and actively participate in the fitting of their animals. In the interest of safety an education, an exhibitor may be assisted at the Wyoming State Fair in the fitting of their animal. Assistance is defined as a learning opportunity where the person doing the assisting is educating the youth exhibitor on the technique of ethical fitting as outlined within the premium book. Anyone found in violation of this rule may be subject to immediate disqualification or removal from the fairgrounds by State Fair Management.
 Unethical Fitting at the Wyoming State Fair is defined as: the injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State, or Local Law, or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law; the injection or internal or external administration of any product or material, whether gas, solid, or liquid, to an animal that, conceals, enhances, or transforms the true conformation, configuration, breed, condition or age or by making the animal appear more sound than otherwise would appear; the administration, use or application of any drug or feed additive affecting the central nervous system; the administration of diuretics for cosmetic purposes; tissue manipulation, removal, surgical attachment or otherwise to change, conceal, enhance, or transform the true conformation or configuration of the animal; attaching to the hide foreign objects including hair/wool or hair/wool substitutes, cloth or fiber; any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conducive to the continued health or marketability of beef, sheep, swine or goat carcasses. Maintaining the integrity of the meat derived from the livestock exhibited at the Wyoming State Fair is the primary reason for the policies and procedures. Most of the market animals shown at the WSF were previously shown and sold before entry to the WSF. Exhibitors have a moral a
- 10. Stalling/Pens. All Youth show animals must be housed in the designated Youth section, unless given special written permission by the Youth Livestock Superintendent of the species in question, in cooperation and agreement with the applicable Open Show Superintendent.
- 11. Bedding. There is no bedding provided. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding. Read page 11.
- 12. Livestock Trailers. The State Fair will designate allocated space for youth livestock support/feed trailers near the livestock barns. NO LIVESTOCK may be in a support/feed trailer at ANY TIME. If an animal is found in a support/feed trailer, both the animal exhibit and the exhibitor will be disqualified. Complimentary permits are provided to each FFA Advisor and 4-H Educator based on their number of WSF registered livestock exhibitors. Read on page 107.
- **13. Feed Delivery Vehicles.** Complimentary permits are provided to each FFA Advisor and 4-H Educator based on their number of WSF registered livestock exhibitors. Read on page 107.
- **14. Blocking Chutes, Trim Tables, Fitting Stands and Fans.** All livestock fans must be suspended. No fans attached to a cart or dolly. No butt fans. No fans in pedestrian walkways. Fans or equipment, in use by exhibitors, that is deemed to be obstructing safety or space, needed pen space, or facility operations will be requested to be removed by State Fair management. Safety guidelines, as set by the Wyoming State Fire Marshal, must prevail.



- 15. Judges/Judging. All judges' decisions are final. No person shall be permitted to judge a class in which he/she may be competing for an award or have an ownership of any animal or article entered in such class. Judges are earnestly requested to familiarize themselves with the Rules & Regulations of this show. If any exhibitor interferes with the judges in the performance of their duties by letter, act, or otherwise, he/she shall be excused from competition and exhibition for such period as Management may determine and shall forfeit any awards received at this Fair. Any person, not an exhibitor, who interferes with the judges in any manner during the performance of duties, shall be asked to leave the judging arena. Unsportsmanlike Conduct. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated, and offending exhibitors may; forfeit awards and premiums, be dismissed immediately from the fairgrounds, and/or lose future eligibility at the Wyoming State Fair. This is considered a violation of the National Code of Show Ring Ethics. Read pages 11-13.
- 16. Reporting Violations. Witnessed violations of the Youth Show Rules should be reported to an adult to then be addressed as follows:
 - 1. To the FFA Advisor or 4-H Educator of the member whose entry is involved.
 - 2. If the situation is not resolved, report to the state organizational leadership of the member. (State 4-H Coordinator or State FFA Advisor)
 - 3. If the situation is not resolved, report to a member of the WSF Youth Show Committee to review.
 - 4. If the situation might need legal attention, an appeal can be made through the WSF formal protest process only after steps 1-3 have been followed.
- 17. Protests. All formal protests from the Youth Livestock Show, must be made by a current Youth Livestock Show exhibitor and must be submitted in writing, be signed by the Youth exhibitor(s), and be accompanied by \$100 cash or certified check (Fee refunded if protest is sustained). The protest must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the State Fair Director immediately after the occasion for the protest. A protest pertaining to eligibility is most suitable when submitted prior to judging. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an entry will be considered. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation. Depending on the basis of the protest, interested parties may be notified and given the opportunity to submit evidence. A decision may be withheld until a complete investigation can be made.
- 18. Suggestions/Comments. Any person or group is encouraged to offer constructive comments and/or provide recommendations to improve the Wyoming State Fair Youth Livestock Show experience, to benefit all Wyoming youth show participants, at the present time and for the future. Comments may be made by visiting www.wystatefair.com

GENERAL YOUTH LIVESTOCK POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- 1. All Youth livestock entries are to be made by computer from the county level. Computer entry deadline is Friday, Aug 11, 2023 for youth horse show, and 6:00 PM, Saturday, August 12, 2023 for all other youth entries.
- 2. All Youth Show exhibitors must have medical release forms from their respective youth organization.
- 3. Each FFA or 4-H exhibitor in this department is required to pay a processing fee as a condition toward application for entry. Processing fees are established as follows: \$20.00 per head for beef cattle (breeding, market, feeder calf and cow/calf pair); \$15.00 equine (halter and performance); \$10.00 per head for sheep (breeding and market), swine (breeding and market), and all goats; \$3.00 per rabbit; \$3.00 per bird (poultry); and \$3.00 per wool fleece.

 These fees are to be paid in full by the deadline of 8:00 P.M., Tuesday, August 15, 2023. If fees are not paid in full, the exhibitor(s) will either forfeit the right to compete in the 2022 Wyoming State Fair or must pay a late processing fee of \$50 per county and/ or chapter to be accepted.
- 4. Based on the board directive in September of 2022, the WSF will defer to the State Vets for guidelines on CVIs and Brand Inspections. For information regarding certificates of veterinary inspection and brand inspections please refer to the State Vet guidelines available at https://wlsb.state.wy.us/public

When a question arises concerning the health of any animal exhibited on the fairgrounds, the Show Superintendent shall consult with the State Fair Veterinarian and recommend an action to the Fair Management. Said animal may be dismissed or quarantined, if necessary.

All livestock brought to the Wyoming State Fair must be accompanied by a current brand inspection, when applicable.

- 5. NOTICE: Advisors and/or Agents making entry for the Youth Livestock Show are to figure animal head count/stall/pen needs accurately and properly, especially in the case where facilities have specified limits for space allowed per county and/or chapter. Those individual counties/chapters who exceed allocation shall be fined \$100.00 and the processing fees for the upcoming (next State Fair) year shall double (i.e., \$10.00 sheep fee goes to \$20.00) for all youth livestock shows.No exceptions. Honesty and integrity are the guide.
- 6. During official class judging, only the exhibitor will be allowed in the show ring. In case of exhibitor sickness or other emergency, an animal may be shown by a substitute exhibitor, providing the substitute is a bona-fide Wyoming 4-H or FFA member and the Show Superintendent grants permission in writing and is recorded in advance of the show for an animal class. In Showmanship Classes, exhibitors must show their own animal.
- 7. Youth exhibitors are encouraged to enter Open Class shows and <u>MUST PRE-ENTER</u> by the July 24 entry deadline or as stated in the specific Open Class Show. Youth sheep exhibitors must enter the open sheep show by 6:00 p.m. Thursday, August 17. Please note entry fees, late fee charges and registration paper requirements for Open Class Entries. Original registration papers, or photocopies thereof, must be presented for all animals entered in classes so requiring. Absolutely no "applied for" registrations will be accepted.
- 8. In case the total department premiums exceed the established premium budget, premiums will be scaled down as designated by State Fair management to meet budget.

In the case where no donor is designated, there will be no special award presented.

- 9. There will be no dogs allowed in the Livestock Barns. Please review the guidelines and policy for dogs in the front of this State Fair Guide.
- 10. Each Youth member having livestock for show is required to keep their display area clean and have the stalls orderly at all times. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premiums and/or awards.


Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirments may forfeit awards/premiums from the show. Stall cards are to be completed and on display for the duration of the fair.





New This Year! ANIMAL DRUG TESTING

NEW for 2023, the Wyoming State Fair will be drug testing Swine, Beef, Goats and Sheep. For these market species, drug testing will be mandatory for the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion award winners and two randomly selected market animals from each species.



At the Wyoming State Fair we value education, animal welfare, protecting the food chain, and fostering fair competition. Drug testing is a valuable tool to help exhibitors and families to understand the possible implications of using substances on their animal exhibit.

HOW

By 12 pm on opening day of the 2023 Wyoming State Fair, exhibitors MUST turn in their drug declaration forms to the Exhibitor Office drop box ONE FORM IS REQUIRED PER MARKET ANIMAL. Drug Declaration forms can be found at www.wystatefair.com or picked up at the Exhibitor Office.

GRANDS & RESERVES

Sample collection will take place immediately following the judge's selection. Fair Management and/or Jordy Drug Testing, along with a parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen for the exhibitor will remain with the animal until a sample has been successfully collected. The animal will be escorted to the photo backdrop and then placed in the secure area until a sample has been collected, sealed and signed off on by the exhibitor along with the parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen. Chain of custody best practices shall be followed. Buckles will be presented ringside and used for photos, then held at the Wyoming State Fair office until the test results have come back negative. Exhibitors will receive a letter informing them of the results of the test and, if negative or excusable, their buckles and premiums.

RANDOM TESTS

Prior to animals entering the show ring, a class and placement will be announced that will be required to do a random drug test. Immediately after judging, the animal will be escorted by Jordy Drug Testing and/or a State Fair Representative, along with a parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen for the exhibitor to the secured area by the photo backdrop and remain with the animal until a sample has been successfully collected, sealed and signed off on by the exhibitor along with the parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen. Chain of custody best practices shall be followed. Exhibitors will receive a letter informing them of the results of the test and, if negative or excusable, their premiums.

REPERCUSSIONS FOR POSITIVE TESTS

Upon receiving a positive test result from Texas A&M, a review panel will determine the repercussion for the exhibitor. The determination made by the review panel is final and not eligible for protest.

In the event that a positive test is deemed inexcusable by the review panel, the exhibitor will forfeit premiums and awards for the exhibit that tested positive.

If a Grand or Reserve Champion animal is disqualified, places will not advance up, meaning that there will be not be a Grand or Reserve Champion awarded for that species, as applicable.

Based on the nature of the positive test, repercussions will vary from 1-3 year probation periods to 1-3 year suspensions. During a probation period, the exhibitor's market livestock exhibits must be drug tested during the Wyoming State Fair. The exhibitor will be responsible for drug testing fees during the probation period. During a suspension period, the exhibitor will not be permitted to show during the Wyoming State Fair.

- 7. If eligible, exhibitors may show in both 4-H Showmanship and FFA Showmanship.

GENERAL POLICIES

- 1. No Youth Beef Cattle will be allowed to be stalled before 8 a.m. on Monday, August 14, 2023.
- 2. A processing fee of \$20.00 per animal entered is to be paid at the time of making entry.
- All cattle exhibited in the Youth Beef Show must be recorded as a 4-H or FFA project and be designated to represent the member's respective county or chapter. All exhibitors are directly accountable to their Extension Agents and 4-H Leaders and/or Ag Education Instructors and FFAAdvisors.
- Any beef animal inadvertently entered in the wrong class may be assigned to the correct class. Animals that do not fit into established classes will not be allowed to show.
- 5. All Youth Show beef cattle will be stalled in the assigned stalls and assigned tie-outs only. All stalls, or any change in stalling, must be approved by the Youth Beef Superintendent. No breeding cattle will be shown without birth dates supplied to the Youth Show Office.
- Any violation of the following policies will result in immediate disqualification of the exhibitor from the Youth Beef Show. Further forfeiture of awards, future privileges and disciplinary action may be taken.
 - a) No use of any artificial tail head, tail fin, artificial poll, or adding any hair or hair-like substance.
 - b) No showing of livestock of any ineligible age or showing unethically fitted livestock. Unethical fitting is deemed to consist of any method which alters the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, or any animal having been operated on or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults or with the intent to deceive.
- 7. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tailheads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited. The dying, or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and/or color is prohibited.
- 8. Fitting chutes/stands inside the barn must be in designated areas as determined by the Open/YouthBeef Superintendents. Trim stands/fitting chutes will only be allowed to be left standing in designated areas. Each county and/or chapter is allowed to bring on grounds only one chute/stand per three (3) head of cattle stalled in the beef barns.
- Unfitted is defined as no compounds used on hair, hooves, or skin. Clean, dry, combed hair is acceptable.
- 10. Classifying the Market Beef at the State Fair does NOT mandate similar procedures at County Fairs. Showing cattle by height is advantageous only when sufficient numbers are available to insure some uniformity. County Fairs may be best served by classifications based on weight or a combination of both hip height and weight.
- 11. Cattle are required to be stalled in the barn from 8:00 A.M. until 7:00 P.M. each day. ALL TIE-OUTS MUST BE IN THE BARN BY 8:00 A.M. AND REMAIN IN THE ASSIGNED STALLS UNTIL 7:00 P.M. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. VIOLATIONS OF THESE TIMES WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF YOUTH BEEF SHOW PREMIUMS. NO PANELS IN TIEOUTS.
- All Youth Beef cattle entering Open Class Shows must preenter with respective beef association.
- Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirments may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.
- There will be no premiums paid for Youth Beef Showmanship classes

POLICIES

- Breed Association registration papers are not required, but are recommended for youth breeding cattle. All entries should be pheno-typical of the breed class entered and be of high quality.
- 2. The Youth Show Committee has full and final authority to designate the most appropriate class for each individual breeding exhibit. NOTE: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to present a crossbred or questionable animal to the Youth Show Committee for a visual appraisal and decision 48 hours BEFORE the day of the show. Unapproved animals, untypical of the class entered, may be dismissed from the ring, the exhibitor disqualified, all privileges forfeited and may require additional disciplinary action to be taken.
- 3. Bulls should be shown with nose lead.
- 4. Youth Breeding Beef classes will be posted by superintendent and exhibitors need to confirm entries.
- 5. Show Management may combine or divide designated classes at their discretion for the best exhibition. If seven (7) or more females from one specific breed arrive on grounds and are processed, a separate breed show will be provided for. No special classes, or classes beyond the ages given, will be added.
- 6. ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS: The Class code must include the Division Number and Class Number.

 EXAMPLE: If you are entering Black Angus in Class No. 4; your class entry would be: 1601 for Youth Breeding Beef Division; and class 4 for Black Angus Spring yearling heifer, calved between Mar. 1 & April 30, 2022.)





- A processing fee of \$10.00 per animal is to be paid at the time of making entry.
- All Market goat exhibitors must verify their entries with the Show Superintendent and Coordinator during check-In beginning at 6:00 P.M., Monday, August 14. All market goats must be weighed Tuesday, August 15, 8:00 A.M.
- Exhibitors are to read and abide by Animal Health requirements for goats. All market goats must have USDA/APHIS Scrapie identifications tags in place prior to arrival.
- Ownership and possession date for all Market Goats is June 1.
- 5. Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8 inch of hair or less, at the time of arrival on the fairgrounds. Legs may have hair up to the hock and knee only. Slick shorn goats are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/ powder/airbrushing or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification.
- Market goats may be wethers or non-bred does. Market goats
 are to have milk teeth in place or may have lost one or
 both of their milk teeth, but there shall be no evidence of
 breaking skin or eruption of the two permanent front teeth.
- 7. Market goats must weigh a minimum of 50 pounds, with no set upper weight limit. Underweight market goats will not be allowed to show. Goats need to be of a marketable weight and size. Market goats will be weighed one time; No weigh-backs will be allowed.
- 8. All market goats will be checked for properly placed Wyoming State Fair designated ear tags and/or tattoos at processing.
- 9. Exhibitors are allowed to use halters or collars when showing their market goat.
- 10. Classes will be established using breeds and then by natural or logical weight breaks, by the Show Superintendent following the weigh-in/processing time on Tuesday, August 16 at 8:00am. Breed Classes with nine (9) or less total entries will be combined with the Any Other Breed.
- Champion and Reserve Champion winners in each breed division will return to the show ring, to compete for Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Goat.
- 12. Premiums offered shall be the same as designated in the general policies section.
- 13. ABUSE: The Wyoming State Fair does not condone excessive bracing, slapping, or lifting the legs of market lambs/market goats in the show ring or while on grounds.
- 14. The slapping or lifting of Market Goats in the show ring is not allowed. All goats must have four feet on the ground during the judge's inspection or handling. Lifting feet off the ground or placing feet on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. Exhibitors will receive one warning if they are found lifting or slapping goats. Second offense will result in automatic exhibitor and animal disqualification.

POLICIES

- 1. The exhibitor and parent code of conduct will be observed and enforced. It can be found on pages 11-13 #31.
- 2. A processing fee of \$15.00 per head per division is to be paid at the time the entry is made.
- 3. All classes are determined by the exhibitor's age. Whether 4-H or FFA members, you should enter the appropriate age division class. Age divisions are: Juniors 8-10 years old, Intermediates 11-13 years old, Seniors 14-18 years old.
- 4. The top two placing 4-H members from each county and the top placing FFA member from each chapter at the most recent county competition are the eligible entrants. Dropping down in the placing of entrants to fill specific class entries will be allowed. Halter horses need not have placed first at the county level but must be of halter quality and must have been shown by the exhibitor at the county level.
- Animal Health requirements refer to page 50 for Equine requirements.
- Youth exhibitors pay no stall charges. Stalls will be available Sunday at 9 AM.
- 7. Stall assignments will be made upon arrival at the stall building at the south end of the PEPSI equine center. To be stalled together, you must arrive together. Exhibitors who do not clean their stalls at the end of the show will be subject to a stall cleaning charge of \$20. Stalls are to be vacated by the end of the show on Tuesday (unless prior arrangements have been made in writing and confirmed with the stalling office.) Failure to clean stalls will result in forfeiture of premium earnings. Check out must be done with the stall office, not the horse show office.
- Stall office hours will be 7A.M. to 7 P.M. daily starting Sunday, August 13, 2023.
- Youth show exhibitors are to check in with the horse show office, at the north end of PEPSI center to receive contestant number and pattern book. Horse show office hours are Sunday, August 13, 3:30 P.M. - 5:00 P.M., Monday, August 15 and Tuesday, August 16, 7:00 A.M. - end of show.
- No exhibitor may enter more than one horse in any class that may require rail work.
- 11. Mixed teams (4H & FFA) will be allowed in the Team Roping, provided that the team was entered properly in advance. Each team must enter as a team, and each team member must be from the same county.
- 12. Mixed teams (4H & FFA) may also enter ranch sorting. They must enter as a team and be from the same county.
- 13. All 4-H and FFA equines entered must be the same as recorded by the 4-H or FFA member in his/her project.
- 14. NO STALLIONS are allowed in the Youth Horse Show.
- 15. Safe horsemanship guidelines must be followed at all times during the Youth Horse Show to protect exhibitors and spectators. Unsafe practices will be prohibited (i.e. Riding double, riding bareback, riding with halters, riding at a speed greater than a walk outside of an arena). All animals must be under control at all times during the youth show. Unruly animals may be excused.
- 16. In the interest of safety, a parent, leader or advisor may help check or change tack, hold the horse, saddle, bridle or halter the horse prior to the member entering the arena.
- 17. The American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) rulebook will be used to determine appropriate course of action for all performance and showmanship classes. Barrel Racing, Pole Bending, Goat Tying, Team Roping and Breakaway Roping will use National High School Rodeo Association (NHSRA) Rules. The judge's interpretation of any rule or guideline is final competition is not sponsored by Wyoming 4-H and any inquiries about rules, enforcement, awards, or processes should be directed to the Wyoming State Fair staff and superintendents.
- 18. Judges will provide all other patterns and may choose form any resource. Pattern selections will not be announced in advance of State Fair. Patterns will be posted at the horse show office and pattern booklets will be provided at the horse show office.
- Contestants will be denied entry into a class if they are not present for the last call into the ring.

- 20. At judge's discretion performance classes that exceed 20 exhibitors may be randomly divided into smaller groups and the top contestants from each group will be brought back for the final placing. No premiums provided for split classes - only final placings.
- All entrants in Stock events MUST pay stock charge at time of entry. Stock Charges per exhibitor: \$10 Goat Tying, Breakaway Roping and Team Roping, \$35 Working Cow Horse and \$35 Ranch Sorting. NO REFUNDS.

- Each exhibitor may enter a total of 20 individual birds, in all divisions.
- Individual birds entered in trios or fryer pens will not be permitted to compete for individual prizes, nor compete as part of another trio or fryer pen.
- 7. Some cages may be provided by the Wyoming State Fair, to be used as holding cages only.
- 8. All birds must be owned by the exhibitor by June 1, 2023 to be eligible to show at the Wyoming State Fair.
- If less than three (3) birds are entered in a class, they will be combined with a similar class, as determined by show management.
- Wyoming State Fair encourages Youth Show exhibitors to wear 4-H or FFA emblems. These emblems may be on any long sleeved garment.

POLICIES

- A processing fee of \$3.00 per animal entered is to be paid at the time of making entry. Entries are due by 6:00 p.m., Saturday, August 12.
- Due to the rapid development of diseases in rabbits, rabbits will be inspected at an animal health inspection site, off grounds, prior to entry on grounds. Any rabbit showing symptoms of disease shall not be allowed on grounds or shall be removed from the show area immediately. Any associated costs, will be the responsibility of the owner and all entry fees will be forfeited.
- Rabbits do not necessarily need to be pedigreed or registered or meet ARBA standards; however, exhibitors are encouraged to breed and show high quality, individual rabbits.
- 4. No more than two rabbits may be shown in each class by the same exhibitor. Due to small numbers, varieties in many breeds, will be shown together. All rabbit entries must be made as described in the 2023 entry information of the State Fair packet. The entries must be submitted by the University Extension Agent or FFA Advisor with all other State Fair entries on Saturday prior to the show. No rabbit entries will be accepted the day of the show.
- 5. If an animal is shown in a Fur Class, it must also have been shown in its respective Breed Class. Animals disqualified for reasons other than health, may still show in the Fur Class. Fryer fur animals should be shown out of a meat pen only.
- Instruction sheet and comment card(s) will be handed out during check-in starting at 8:00 a.m. Complete comment card per instructions and be sure to put rabbit's class number, in upper right corner of comment card.
- 7. Rabbit identification sometimes slows down the show. To speed up that process, exhibitors are asked to have all rabbits tattooed in the left ear. Please record tattoo number on the coop card. Valid entries from the county or chapter should include the computer entry plus a coop card. This will speed up the show.
- 8. Wyoming State Fair encourages Youth Show exhibitors to wear 4-H or FFA emblems. These emblems may be on any long sleeved garment. That garment cannot contain ARBA or individual rabbitry names or emblems.
- There are four separate showmanship contests for rabbits: FFA Showmanship • Senior 4-H Showmanship • Intermediate 4-H Showmanship • Junior 4-H Showmanship There will be no premiums paid for Rabbit Showmanship classes.
- Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirements may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.
- Current classes and varieties are the result of trends over the years. Additions and deletions are made each year based upon the trends shown by coop card numbers.,

POLICIES

- 1. The Superintendent(s) have jurisdiction regarding pen/stall assignments and the number of animals per pen.
- Sheep shall be penned two per stall. Ram lambs will be penned two per stall. Yearling Rams shall be penned separtately. The superintendent shall pen larger breeds accordingly if deemed necessary. Siblings may be penned together if space is needed.
- 3. No Goats housed in Youth Sheep Barn. NO Fitting of Goats/Beef in the designated Youth Sheep Area.
- 4. Extreme docking of lambs is not an acceptable animal husbandry practice; refer to page 13, rule #33. Any sheep showing signs of rectal prolapse shall be disqualified and must be immediately removed from the fairgrounds by the exhibitor.
- No sheep will be allowed to be penned before 8:00 a.m. on Monday, August 14, 2023.
- A processing fee of \$10.00 per animal entered is to be paid at the time of making entry.
- 7. Ewe lambs entered, processed and shown as breeding animals may not be exhibited as market animals. Ewe lambs entered, processed and shown as market animals, may not be exhibited as breeding animals. WSF market tags must be removed from all breeding ewe lambs.

- 8. Wood shavings will not be provided for sheep pens. Wood shavings are available for purchase, through the show management, at designated locations from 7-9 a.m. and 6-8 p.m. daily. Straw may be used as bedding if provided by the exhibitor.
- 9. Unauthorized Animals: Only sheep officially entered will be allowed on show grounds. Any sheep brought onto the grounds which is/are NOT entered for competition or exhibition will be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 10. All sheep must have USDA Scrapie Tags in place.
- Any exhibitor or anyone assisting an exhibitor shall not aggressively or loudly "pop, slap, hit, or strike" their animal at anytime during the show or any place on the fairground's property.
- Lifting the sheep in a fluid motion to set the front legs prior to quickly setting the feet back on the ground is acceptable.
- Placing feet on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. All sheep must have four feet on the ground during Judge's inspection.
- All sheep must have clean water available to drink in pens at all times.
- Only one trimming stand allowed per exhibitor. No lamb sale racks, supplement carts, extra feed or bedding shall be stored in stalling area.
- 16. All livestock fans must be mounted at least five (5) feet high on stationary mounts. No fans in pedestrian walkways. No extension cords strung across alley ways. Fans or equipment, in use by exhibitors, that is deemed to be obstructing safety or space, needed pen space, or facility operations will be requested to be removed by State Fair Management.
- All tack of exhibitors will be confined to designated areas by the show superintendent/coordinator and only if pen space allows.
- Stall cards are to be completed and on display for the duration of the fair.
- Herdsmanship is an important componet of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirements may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.

Youth Breeding Sheep

- Breeding sheep in breeds must be purebred or registered. Sheep in Breed D and J (commercial, crossbred wool type and commercial, crossbred wether type) are not required to be purebred or registered, but must be individually identified. All sheep must have USDA/APHIS Scrapie Tags in place.
- 2. Every animal entered as purebred (registered) must have a registration paper issued by the respective breed association. Registered animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name, exhibitor's immediate family name or exhibitor's farm name or FFA chapter name and must be done so prior to ownership deadline. A duplicate of the original breed certificate must be presented to the Show Superintendent/Coordinator and on file by Tuesday August 15, 2023 at 9:00 A.M., no applied for registration allowed. Tattoos, eartags or other identification marks must match registration certificates.

Sheep in Breed D and J are not required to be purebred or registered but must be individually identified by scrapie tag number on a bill of sale/brand inspection that proves ownership prior to ownership date. A duplicate of ownership papers is to be presented to the Show Superintendent/Coordinator and on file by Tuesday August 15, 2023 at 9:00 A.M..

All sheep not registered will show in these division Due to the absence of breed certificate Commercial Crossbred wether type ewe lambs will show by weight and will be processed prior to market lamb weigh-ins. Commercial Crossbred wether type ewe lambs must still have their lamb teeth with no exposure of yearling teeth and may be mouthed to verify age at the discretion of the



show management at any time. If a commercial crossbred wether type ewe has lost a temporary incisor or has visible signs of permanent incisors the ewes weight will be disregarded and said ewe will show in the yearling ewe class.

All commercial crossbred wether type will show slick shorn. Slick shorn shall be defined as no wool above the knees or hocks. Heads and flank wool will be shorn. All slick shorn sheep will be shorn within 10 days of processing. Slick shorn sheep are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/airbrushing or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification. All slick shorn sheep will be housed in the Youth Barn. No exceptions.

The following breeds will have an option of showing in a slick shorn class or a fitted with fleece class:

- a) Dorset
- b) Hampshire
- c) Suffolk
- d) AOB Meat

The following breeds will be shown as fitted with fleece. No slick shorn exhibits in these breeds allowed.

- a) Columbia
- b) Targhee
- c) AOB Wool
- d) Commercial Crossbred Wool Type

Fitted Sheep shall be defined as having at least 1" of wool on the majority of the body.

Fitted Breeds and Commercial Crossbreed Wool Type Sheep will be housed in the Open Sheep barn. No Exceptions. If an exhibitor has both fitted and slick shorn, please make preparations to be stalled in both barns. Exhibitors with both market and fitted breeding need to be aware they will be housed in separate barns. Fitted sheep shall be exhibited according to National Breed Standards that apply to the fitting of that breed.

The Champion Ram and Ewe from each Purebred division (both fitted and slick shorn) will compete for an Overall Supreme Ram and Ewe. The Champion Ram and Ewe from each Commercial division will compete for Supreme Commercial Ram and Ewe.

- 3. All yearling ewes are subject to being mouthed at the discretion of the show management at any time.
- 4. A flock shall consist of one eligible age ram, 2 yearling ewes and 2 ewe lambs. All animals must be owned by one individual and shown in either 4-H or FFA, but not both.
- Should 25 head or more be entered in any class, the class will be randomly split into two subclasses for elimination judging. No premiums paid for subclasses.
- Youth show exhibitors are encouraged to enter the Open Sheep Show with enteries and fees due by 6:00 P.M., Thursday, August 17 at the Open Sheep Show Office. No late entries will be accepted.

- 7. Weighing of all market sheep will be Tuesday, August 15, following commercial ewe lambs at 9:30 A.M. No blankets, tubes or leg wraps during processing. Halters will be removed at scale. Rope halters are encouraged during processing.
- Market lambs must weigh a minimum of 100 pounds. Underweight lambs will not be allowed to show. Each lamb is allowed only one trip through for verification, processing and weighing. No weigh-backs allowed.
- 9. All market lambs must have their lamb teeth in place.
- All market lambs will be checked to have the proper RFID ear tags in place at processing.
- 11. All market sheep will be slick shorn. Slick shorn shall be defined as no wool above the knees or hocks. Heads and flank wool will be shorn. All slick shorn sheep will be shorn within 10 days of processing. Slick shorn sheep are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/airbrushing or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification. All slick shorn sheep will be housed in the Youth Sheep Barn. No Exceptions.
- Exhibitors will individually show market lambs. No leg setters, or assistants allowed in show ring unless approved in writing before the show by the Youth Sheep Superintendent.

- 1. Youth swine shows will be classified by breed, then weight using natural breaks or logical separations.
- 2. Weigh-In: There will be no official weigh-in of Market Swine. Each exhibitor will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight via a weight card* to be turned in to the Swine Superintendents no later than Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at 1:00 pm. (*Weight card-scale card to record: name, animal tag number, class and declared weight. A scale will be available to verify animal weight.)
- **3. Weigh-Back:** There will be a weigh-back in class of the top three market swine with a 5% variance allowed.
- 4. Weight range for market swine will be: Minimum 225 pounds. Any swine underweight will not be allowed to show.
- Classes will be established by breed division and then weight within each breed division respectively by the Swine Superintendent following processing.
- Champions and Reserve Champions from each of the breed divisions will compete for Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Market Swine.
- Exhibitors will need to designate which breed to enter. Classes with total entries of 9 or less will be added to AOB Dark or AOB Light classes.
- 8. Any market swine classified out of the entered breed class by the Breed Verification Task Force, will be required to show in the Dark or Light Crossbred classes.

POLICIES

- Youth exhibitors are encouraged to enter Open Class Wool and MUST PRE-ENTER the same fleeces by the July 25 entry deadline, with paid entry fees, as stated in the Open Class Show regulations.
- 2. FLEECES WILL BE SHOWN UNTIED IN CLEAR BAGS.
- 3. A processing fee of \$3.00 per fleece entered is to be paid at the time of making entry.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter two (2) fleeces in any one class, and entries may be made in as many classes as desired. An individual fleece may be entered in one class only. Any fleece entered in both the Youth and Open shows must be entered in the same class with the same name.
- 5. <u>ELIGIBILITY OF FLEECES</u>: Each fleece entered must have been grown by a Wyoming 4-H or FFA member and be from sheep recognized as part of current project work and have been shorn in 2022 or 2023. Fleeces shown at the 2022 Fair are not eligible for the 2023 Wyoming State Fair. Each fleece must represent not more than 12 months growth, except that in the case of yearling fleeces, where 16 months growth will be allowed.
- 6. <u>FLEECE QUALITY:</u> Any fleece entered in competition shall be discriminated against if: (a) tied with anything but paper twine; (b) showing any paint or tar brands (soluble branding fluids permissible); (c) showing excessive dung locks or tags; (d) discolored by excessive moisture; (e) cotted; (f) showing a weak staple or break in fiber; or (g) containing any excess burrs or other vegetable matter. Fleeces showing black fibers will be disqualified.
- 7. PREPARATION OF FLEECES: Fleeces need not be tied but must be prepared in the same fashion. Spread out the fleece on a clean table or floor, skin side down, taking care not to pull or open fleece as it is handled. The fleece will look like a pelt or hide. At this stage, before rolling or tying, remove all heavy tags, stained wool, and obvious foreign matter. Rolling the fleece takes four easy steps: (1) Begin at one side and loosely fold 8 to 10 inches of the edge toward the center of the fleece. (2) Do the same on the other side, but fold toward the center two times until the twice folded portion lies on top of the first fold. (3) Fold in the head wool. (4) Roll the entire fleece from the breech toward the shoulder and long side wool. Fleece SHOULD NOT contain belly wool. Place fleece in a clear, breathable plastic bag.
- 8. Fleeces must be delivered to the wool barn no later than 7 p.m., Monday, August 14.
- 9. Fleeces will be released starting at 9 p.m., Saturday, August 19.

YOUTH HOUSING-DORMITORIES

In recognition of the achievements of Wyoming youth in earning a trip to the Wyoming State Fair, the fair provides the use of dormitory style housing on grounds for the benefit of youth exhibitors.

FACILITIES

- The fair dormitories have bunk beds, foam mattresses, showers and lavatories. The female dormitory also has clothes racks.
- All youth and adult chaperones staying in the dormitories must provide their own bedding (sheets, pillows, pillow cases and blankets), towels, soap, personal hygiene items, clothes hangers and any other personal belongings as needed.
- 3. Individuals are responsible for all personal belongings.

ELIGIBILITY

- Only bonafide 4-H and FFA youth contestants who are participants in contests or educational activities during the State Fair along with official adults serving as dormitory chaperones are eligible to stay in youth housing.
- If space is available, Extension Educators, Agricultural Education (FFA) Advisors, and other designated chapter/county adult leaders may be allowed to stay in youth housing.
- 3. Children under eight years of age will not be allowed to stay in the dormitories.

COSTS

- Dormitory use fees are \$60.00 per full week (Sunday thru Sunday).
- 2. No single day rates will be available.
- 3. Each individual who stays in a dormitory is required to pay the \$60.00 usage fee.
- Dormitories will be available for occupancy on Sunday, August 13 at 3:00 p.m. and will close on Sunday, August 20 at 10:00 A.M.

REGISTRATION

- 1. Processes specific to each youth organization will be utilized.
 - a) For FFA DORMS, see page 108, #8-12 and contact Stacy Broda.
 - b) For 4-H DORMS, see page 114, #2 and contact Mandy Marnie or the State 4-H office.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the FFA or 4-H personnel to verify the arrival of the youth members named on the housing registration.

PRIVILEGES

- Youth having dormitory privileges are required to abide by established policies and cooperate with fair and dormitory management for the enjoyment and benefit of all involved.
- Advisors, agents and adult chaperones are responsible and accountable for the conduct of their youth delegation as well as designated chaperones at all times.
- 3. Individual or group violators of policies, deadlines or other established guides for conduct will face disciplinary and/or legal action.
- For safety reasons: Each individual staying in the dormitory will be required to have proper identification, easily visible at all times, for access to the dormitories.

PETS

 There will be no pets or animals of any type allowed in the dormitories; exception for written requests for service dogs for those individuals with sight or hearing impairment.

HOURS

- All youth and adults staying in the dorm shall be in by 10:30 p.m. each evening or at the designated curfew time as posted by the Wyoming State Fair and the youth programs involved.
- Adult chaperones are responsible to insure that each and all members of their delegation are in prior to the evening deadline.
- 3. Violations of the established time will cause the individual violator to automatically lose their dormitory use and other fairtime privileges for the current fair. The violator will be required to find alternative housing off of the fairgrounds or will be requested to leave the fairgrounds for the duration of the current fair or will have parents called to pick them up the following morning to be taken home for the duration of the current fair.

FORBIDDEN

- 1. Possession or use of alcohol or illegal substance on grounds is absolutely forbidden. Any youth participant, exhibitor, or adult chaperone identified with such substance shall automatically lose the privilege and earned right to represent their FFA Chapter or County 4-H program at State Fair and will immediately be sent home. There will be zero tolerance for alcohol or illegal substance use while involved with the Wyoming State Fair and/or being in the dormitories or on the fairgrounds. Legal action may be pursued for violations.
- There shall be no tobacco use inside the dormitories at any time. Violators will be warned the first time, with a second violation resulting in automatic loss of dormitory use.

MEDICAL

- Each youth participant and designated adult chaperone is covered by accident and health insurance by their individual youth organization.
- 2. Individuals requiring medical assistance are required to contact the head chaperone of the dormitory or contact the administrative office of the participant youth organization; Fort Caspar for 4-H and Fort Laramie for FFA

RESPONSIBILITY

 The Wyoming State Fair assumes no responsibility for the loss of property, accident or illness from utilizing dormitory space at the State Fair.

DORMITORY PARKING

COMPLIMENTARY PARKING

1. The Wyoming State Fair provides complimentary parking passes to one designated AEI or CEA from each participating chapter and county. The number of individual vehicle parking passes provided is based upon the number of registered exhibitors/contestants, staying in the dormitories, from each chapter or county delegation. Delegations having passenger buses will be provided one complimentary parking pass per bus.
