

## 2024 Changes

Check here for a quick guide to the changes that have happened since the 2023 Wyoming State Fair. We will include major rule changes, new divisions and classes, and any classes that have been taken out.

#### **GENERAL**

New order of premium book--check for updated page numbers throughout.

#### YOUTH LIVESTOCK

- This year, Wyoming State Fair, with its Board of Directors, is pleased to announce that placements will be awarded for the TOP FIVE OVERALL, and the TOP FIVE IN EACH BREED for MARKET beef, swine, sheep, and goats.
- Livestock barns will be closed at night from curfew (10:30 PM) until 5:00 AM.
- Youth Horse exhibitors no longer need to qualify to enter and ride in performance classes at WSF. All youth horse classes are open to any bona fide, eligible Wyoming 4-H or FFA exhibitor who has exhibited in their respective and most recent county fair.
- Youth Sheep will use weight cards to declare weight. See Youth Sheep on page 45 for more info.
- Pygmy and Fiber Goats have been removed from the Youth Goat section. If there are any of these animals wishing to exhibit, they may be entered the appropriate age class in the breeding or meat goat divisions.
- Percentage Boer Bucks have been added to the Youth Breeding Meat Goat Show. See page 35.
- Starting in 2025, no horned goats will be allowed in the market classes. Please plan accordingly for next year's projects.

#### **OPEN LIVESTOCK**

- All Open Beef departments except Maine Anjou will take entries via ShoWorks. All entry fees for Angus, Hereford, AORB, and Texas Longhorn will be sent to WSF. All shows (except Maine Anjou) will have an entry deadline of July 24th (via online or mail, postmarked). Most shows will accept late entries with an additional fee. See Open Beef department starting on page 81 for exact fees and late entry deadlines.
- The Performance Lamb contest is taking a hiatus for 2024 but will be back for 2025.

#### OPEN STATIC

- New Divisions! In Visual Arts: Al Assisted Art; in Crafted Arts: Diamond Painting; in Culinary: Sourdough Bread. See each department section for available classes, entry fees, and guidelines.
- In all Open Static Departments, "junior" classes have been renamed "youth" classes. See each department for age breakouts.
- •Needlework entries are due by SATURDAY, AUGUST 10, at 6 PM. Entries will be accepted at the Upper Ag Hall starting Friday, August 9 at 10 AM. Judging will happen on SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, and the exhibit will open on Tuesday with all other exhibit halls. No other static department will accept entries on Friday.

- New guidelines for the Hobby Collections division. See page 98 for more information.
- Needlework has added a class for non-judged (display only) Quilts of Valor. Please indicate if your Quilt of Valor is being entered in the judged class or the non-judged class.
- Edible Landscape entries (under Gardening) are now due by AUGUST 1 (end of day). The exhibitor and the landscape must reside in Wyoming. Photos must be submitted in JPEG or JPG format with attached written files for the descriptions, or as a PDF with written description included in the PDF file. Entries should be able to be easily printed and collated.
- Farm Toy Collection is no longer dually listed under Hobby Collections and Antique Machinery. It is only listed under Hobby Collections division in Crafted Arts.
- New guidelines for awarding individual and troop sweepstakes awards for Scouting. See page 100 for more information.
- Sheep Lead premiums have changed to more accurately reflect class divisions. See page 93 for the current premium schedules and awards.

#### **EXHIBITOR OFFICE**

 New service times for the Exhibitor Office on Monday. ONLY FFAAdvisors/4-H Educators will be able to pick up credential on Monday from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The office will then open for the general public. Tuesday - Friday will be open to all, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM as needed.

#### **Exhibit Buildings**

Ft. Fetterman - Ft. Reno (lower) - Ag Hall (upper) - Wool Barn Open Tue - Sat. 11:00 AM - 8:00 PM

Exhibits must be in place no later than Saturday, August 10, 6:00 PM (Needlework only), Sunday, August 11, 6:00 PM (Visual, Crafted, Culinary, and Gardening).

- All exhibitors will abide by all applicable policies of the Wyoming State Fair and special Department Policies.
- 2. Each exhibitor in these departments, in making application for entry, is required to pay a Processing Fee (Office Charge). See Department Policies for the appropriate fee charged.
- 3. All applications for entry will be made directly on entry forms included in the back of this premium book or from the State Fair website at www.wystatefair.com. If additional pages are needed, photocopies will be accepted. Pre-entry is not required BUT IS STRONGLY SUGGESTED. Having forms submitted ahead of time will expedite entry tags being available when entries are brought in. The entry tag attached to your entry is your record of your entry's placing in its class. Keep the entry tag until all premiums owed you have been received.
- Unless otherwise stated, Open Class Exhibitors need not have exhibited or placed at a County Fair in order to exhibit at State Fair.
- Exhibitor may make only ONE entry in each class.
- ENTRY INFORMATION: When filling out the entry form, the Class Code must include the Division Number and Class Number. EXAMPLE: If you are entering a Watercolor in the Scenery Class, Amateur status, your class entry would be: 103-8 (103 for Amateur Division, and 8 for Watercolors, Scenery).
- 7. Articles to be exhibited may be delivered to the Office of the General Manager of the State Fair. Entry forms must be completely filled out (name, address, etc.) and attached to article, and all Processing Fees must be paid. All transportation charges must be pre-paid, otherwise the exhibit will be refused. Articles to be returned will only be sent if postage is pre-paid. Adequate packaging (box, crate, etc.) for return of the article must be provided to WSF office.
- Department Superintendents reserve the right to change any entry to a more appropriate class to ensure that like items are judged with like items.
- Any item may be entered only one time at the Wyoming State Fair. Violations will result in loss of awards, premiums, and future privileges.
- Articles need not have been winners in a county fair to compete in these divisions/departments, nor do they have to have been entered into a county fair to qualify.
- No article shall be entered to compete for more than one premium, except when it shall count as part of a collection or display.
- 12. No responsibility is assumed by the Wyoming State Fair in case of loss, theft, damage, or breakage of any exhibit, although due caution and care will be exerted to prevent such loss or damage.

- 13. In order to safeguard against loss in these departments, no one will be permitted to handle any article once put in place, with the exception of the department staff or judge. All articles entered for competition shall be under the control of the Superintendent of the Department.
- 14. Articles will be awarded first, second, third, or no premium, according to individual merit. ONLY ONE FIRST, ONE SECOND, AND ONE THIRD PLACE AWARD SHALL BE AWARDED PER CLASS.
- 15. Judges shall not award a prize to an unworthy exhibit. No premiums will be awarded to undeserving exhibits, whether there is competition or not. The judge's decision is final. All judging will be "blind," with the exhibitor's info not displayed to the judge(s).
- 16. Exhibitors may pick up their exhibits from the Department Superintendent on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>August 18 from 7:00 AM until 1:00 PM</u>. No early releases are allowed in the interest of maintaining the integrity of the show. Exhibitor or authorized person should present the exhibitor tag to obtain release of exhibits. Exhibits left in the building with no instructions for return will be held at the Wyoming State Fair Office until picked up by the exhibitor, but not longer than September 1, 2024 (Exceptions- See Culinary and Gardening). Exhibits remaining after September 1st will become the property of WSF.

- All exhibitors will abide by all applicable Policies of the Wyoming State Fair and special Department Policies.
- ALL APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY REQUIRE A COMPLET-ED ENTRY FORMAND THE APPLICABLE PROCESSING FEE. Entry forms are included in the back of this premium book and online at www.wystatefair.com. Please fill out the form in its entirety.
- Professional and advance amateur entries are expected to be original work. Amateurs and youth may exhibit original work or use commercial kits or patterns appropriate to class descriptions. If a kit is used, it must be declared upon entry.
- 4. Articles exhibited in this department must have been completed within the last three years and must not have been shown previously at the Wyoming State Fair. All work entered must be the original work of the exhibitor. Exhibitors may include elements, as apporpriate, as part of the exhibit (i.e., pieces of a fairy or rock garden, Lego bricks, embellishments, etc.), but the overall exhibit must have been created by the exhibitor unless otherwise noted. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS POLICY WILL BE CONSIDERED AN ATTEMPT TO DEFRAUD AND SHALL BE SUFFICIENT REASON TO PERMANENTLY EXCLUDE THE GUILTY PARTY FROM ENTRY IN THIS EXHIBITION.
- Exhibits will be tagged with artist's name when items are checked in. All names on exhibits must be covered so they are not visible at the time of judging.
- 6. Judges shall consider entries on basis of: 1) Content and appropriateness of class, 2) Composition, 3) Technical quality, 4) Overall presentation. ONLY one entry per class may be made. If multiple entries have been made in the same class, one will be reclassified or disqualified prior to judging. Any entries which have been made inadvertently or erroneously may be reclassified by Department Staff.
- PROFICIENCY LEVEL DEFINITIONS: NOTE: Exhibitors may place into a higher proficiency level (except Professional) if they feel qualified to compete; however, an exhibitor cannot go to a lower level.
  - a) PROFESSIONAL refers to those who derive <u>significant income</u> from art and whose work is produced primarily for the <u>purpose of selling</u>; OR who have a diploma, certificate, degree, or <u>three or more years of school training</u>; OR <u>teach in their crafted art media</u>.
  - b) ADVANCED AMATEUR refers to those who have exhibited and won first prizes in accredited or rec-

- ognized shows (including Wyoming State Fair), **OR** who have had professional training or education but have not completed more than three years.
- c) AMATEUR/ADULT refers to those who have not previously won first prizes AND have had little or no training or schooling in the discipline. Also refers to those who are 19 years or older as of August 1 of the current year.
- d) YOUTH refers to those who have not reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday before August 1 of the current year. If a Children's class is also offered in the same division, Youth will refer to those aged 11-18.
- e) CHILDREN refers to those who have not reached their 11<sup>th</sup> birthday by August 1 of the current year (i.e., 10 years old and younger).
- Each division lists the available proficiency levels. Please pay special attention to ensure entry into the most appropriate level.

Collector's name should not appear on the typed cards to ensure blind judging (name and entry # should be on back).

- Canned goods must be exhibited in clear regulation canning jars (half-pint, pint, or quart). All jelly products (jellies, jams, conserves, marmalades, butters) must be processed in a boiling water bath to be judged and must be sealed without paraffin.
- Judges may open jars for tasting, to break ties. Due to potential hazards of food-borne illness, judges WILL NOT open canned meat, or any other canned food entries with meat in the recipe.
- 10. All canned exhibits must contain a label on the jar (not lid) with the following information:

  - c) Process method Boiling Water or Pressure
  - d) Processing time
  - e) Pounds pressure, if applicable (state dial or weighted gauge)
  - f) Style of pack (raw or hot)
  - g) Date processed
  - h) Source of recipe and page number of recipe
  - i) Altitude where product was processed
  - j) Attach copy of recipe to the label and entry tag
- 11. All canned fruits, vegetables, meats, and pickle products must be prepared following procedures, including appropriate altitude adjustments, in the current edition of the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning or the Ball Blue Book (available from local Home Economist/Family and Consumer Science Educator, UW Cooperative Extension Service or from http://uwacadweb.uwyo.edu/cesnutrition/Food\_Preserve/usda\_home\_canning.htm).

Jelly products (jellies, jams, conserves, marmalades, butters) must meet the minimum processing times, including appropriate altitude adjustments, as specified in the current edition of the USDA Complete Guide to Home Canning or the Ball Blue Book.

No fresh or canned fruit in any entry, as there is no refrigeration available.

All dried meat entries must display a recipe. Currently, the University of Wyoming Cooperative Extension Service recommends that all homemade jerky be heat treated in boiling brine. Contact your County Extension Office for a specific recipe, or to http://www.uwyo.edu/ces/pubs/jerky.htm.



- 3. The landscape must be physically in the state of Wyoming and cared for by the exhibitor. Youth exhibitors may be assisted by an older family member or friend.
- Each landscape may only be entered once. Exhibitors at the same residence/location must have separate areas with no crossover.
- Edible Landscape entry must consist of a presentation of at least 4 varieties of plants classified as edible according to USDA Plants database (https://www.ams.usda.gov/services/grants/scbgd/specialty-crop), with at least 2 plants of each variety.
- 6. Photo images plus description of the entire edible landscape project, including names of plant varieties, are required as part of your entry. (A large project may consist of more than 4 varieties). Photos must be in .jpeg or .jpg format and must fit on a standard 8.5 x 11 sheet of paper. A PDF file of all photographs and written description is acceptable as well, to be printed on standard paper.
- 7. Entries will be judged on the submitted photos of the edible landscape plants **and** description of the project. Town location of the edible landscape must be included.
- 8. Specialty crops are defined as "fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops (including floriculture)." Eligible plants must be cultivated or managed and used by people for food, medicinal purposes, and/or aesthetic gratification to be considered specialty crops.
- 9. Examples include cabbage, onions, eggplants, carnations, squash, sunflowers.

**Definition** – A quilt <u>must</u> be constructed from fabric with a top piece and a back piece with batting in between the fabrics and <u>must</u> be quilted and bound.

- PRE-PRINTED PANELS: All entries that are a commercially pre-printed and/or pre-quilted panel should be entered in the Bedcover Division class 510-3. If you have pieced (consisting of more than just adding borders and binding) a pre-printed panel into a quilt top that you have then quilted, it can be entered in the appropriate class in Division 509.
- 2. All work on quilts in Division 509 must be the sole work of the person whose name the quilt is entered under, otherwise it **MUST** be entered in the **GROUP** Quilt Class.
- 3. First-time quilters need to enter under Miscellaneous Quilts, First-Time Quilters, Youth, class 98 or First-Time Quilters, Adult, class 99. To be eligible for the First-Time Quilters Award, it must be the first time exhibitor has exhibited at the Wyoming State Fair in the Needlework Department. (There is no requirement for the entry to be the first quilt that the exhibitor made).
- 4. Quilt Size: Measure the length and width of your quilt-add these two numbers together. This is the figure you will use to determine which class to enter your quilt in. Pin an index card to the front with the length and width written down and the class you would like to enter your quilt in.
- 5. Mixed Media is the combination of two or more techniques. (Example: Applique & pieced work, or a combination of applique, beadwork, embroidery {machine or hand}, and pieced work, etc.). All/any embellishments must be permanently secured to the entry. (We will not allow the temporary use of safety pins to attach embellishments to items so that they can be qualified to enter a mixed media class.) All embellishments need to be a planned and properly executed technique pertinent to the quilts competition classification.
- 6. Professional is one who teaches quilting for fees, makes a practice of selling labor/or completed works, or has been a previous Best of Show winner twice in the non-professional class. It is the sole responsibility of the entrant and NOT the Superintendant that all quilts are entered in their proper Professional and Non-Professional Categories.
- 7. The criteria for entering in a group quilt class, whether to enter in the Professional or Non-professional categories, will be based on who constructed the top. If a non-professional constructs the top but has it professionally quilted, it will then be entered in the non-professional categories.
- 8. The classes in the Miniature Quilts, Wall Hangings, Heritage Quilts, Art Quilts, and the Miscellaneous Quilts categories are open to the Professional and Non-Professional exhibitor. All of the classes can be entered as an individual or as a group quilt classification, meaning more than one person can contribute to these projects.

- 4. Paintings, drawings, and photography exhibited in this department must be the work of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the last three years. Exhibitors entering borrowed or purchased art as their own handiwork will forfeit all rights to participate. Art that is copied from works of others must be so identified, and the name of the creator and title of the original work must be submitted with the article. Photographs must be from exhibitor's original negative or digital file, which must still be the artist's original work. No transparencies. Handiwork, such as hand coloring, dodging, burning, and minor digital adjustments, is acceptable. However, Digital Photos that have been manipulated or have altered the original appearance of the image must be entered in the Digital Creations category. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS POLICY WILL BE CONSIDERED AN ATTEMPT TO DEFRAUD AND SHALL BE SUFFICIENT REASON TO PERMANENTLY EXCLUDE THE GUILTY PARTY FROM THE USE OF THIS EXHIBITION.
- 5. HANGING ATTACHMENTS FOR WALL DISPLAY: Framed with eye screws and wire is the preferred method. Any exceptions are to be approved with Superintendent or Coordinator. For safety purposes, ONLY entries with the approved, proper hanging attachments will be accepted; entries without proper hanging attachments will be turned away until they comply. No string or wire affixed by tape. If the hanging apparatus doesn't make it through the week of exhibitions, it ends up not getting judged or seen! If there is glass on picture, please make sure it is extra secure and not in a pop-out or front-loading frame. Youth/Children's exhibits are the only work that does not need to comply with the aforementioneded, but it must be able to hang from large hooks on pegboard display walls (yarn or string through holes on cardboard or matboard backing is acceptable). All exhibits must have the Artist's name and class code on the back of the artwork. Names should not appear

- on the front of any exhibit. Any names/signatures on the front will need to be covered prior to entry and judging.
- PHOTOGRAPH SIZES: With the exceptions of Best Photo of the Past, children's entries and youth entries, all photographs must be at least 8" x 10". Cropping for matting is allowed, but at least 7 1/2" x 9 1/2" must be visible after framing and matting.
- 6. ENTRYINFORMATION: When filling out the entry form, the Class Code must include the Division Number and Class Number.   - b. ADVANCED AMATEUR refers to those who have exhibited and won <u>first prizes</u> in accredited or recognized shows (State Fair), OR who have had professional schooling but have not completed more than three years.
  - c. AMATEUR refers to those who have not previously won first place prizes AND have had little or no training or schooling in the discipline.
  - d. YOUTH refers to those who have not reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday before August 1 of the current year.
  - e. CHILDREN refers to those who have not reached their 11th birthday by August 1 of the current year.
  - f. SENIOR refers to exhibitors 65 years of age or older as of August 1 of current year.
- 9. Exhibitors wishing to sell their artwork may do so by listing entries, prices, and contact information on a separate paper to be given to the Superintendent in charge. Prices of items CANNOT appear on the front of the work. This is a State Fair exhibition and cannot be used as a sales department. Al Assisted Artwork is art created using a generator tool like Midjourny, DALL-E 2, Jasper Art, and others. It is the artist's responsibility to ensure that they use the generator in accordance with all applicable laws.

- 1. For all classes in this division, a step-by-step account must be provided, with accompanying screenshots, of the prompts/ direction given and the resulting images. This allows the judges to critique grasp of knowledge and proficiency in using the generator to produce the desired results. Exhibits submitted without this step-by-step account will not be judged. This should be submitted on standard letter-sized paper, one-sided, and in color. Artist's name should not appear anywhere on this paperwork.
- 2. For the entire division, no prompts/direction shall reference any specific artist (i.e. you cannot prompt something "in the style of Bob Ross" or "like van Gogh.") Any such direction to a specific artist will be grounds for disqualification, and the piece will not be judged.
- 3. For class 1, a starting image will be provided by WSF and the artist will manipulate it with at least four (4) alterations. For class 2, a starting prompt is given, which must be used as the initial prompt, and then manipulate with at least four (4) alterations.
- 4. Artists are expected to clean up any "glitches" -- i.e., extra appendages, misshapen or distorted features, unrealistic colors or textures (unless going for a surreal effect), unintended elements or duplication. Any glitches that remian will be considered with prejudice for judging.

- 2. ALL APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY REQUIRE A COMPLET-ED ENTRY FORM AND THE APPLICABLE PROCESSING FEE. Entry forms are included in the back of this premium book and online at www.wystatefair.com. Please fill out the form in its entirety.
- 3. FLEECES WILL BE SHOWN UNTIED IN BAGS.
- 4. Entry deadline is August 12, 5:00 PM. Youth Exhibitors are encouraged to also exhibit in the Open Wool Show, and <u>must pre-enter</u> the same fleeces by the August 12 entry deadline.
- 5. Exhibitors may enter two (2) fleeces in any one class, and entries may be made in as many classes as desired. An individual fleece may be entered in one class only. Any fleece entered in both the Youth and Open Shows must be entered in the same class with the same name.
- After screening, some fleeces may be removed so that the higher placing fleeces can be properly displayed for public view.
- 7. ELIGIBILITY OF FLEECES: Each fleece must have been shorn in 2023 or 2024 (fleeces entered in the 2023 State Fair cannot be entered again) and represent 12 months growth or less (yearling fleeces will be allowed 16 months growth).
- 8. JUDGING CRITERIA: Fleeces shall be faulted for: (a) being tied with string, (b) paints or tar brands (soluble branding fluids allowed), (c) excessive dung locks or tags, (d) moisture discoloration, (e) being cotted, (f) a break or weak staple, (g) excess burrs or vegetable matter. Fleeces showing black fiber will be disqualified.
- 9. PREPARATION OF FLEECES: NO TIES/NO BELLIES
- 10. Fleeces need not be tied but must be prepared in the same fashion. Spread out the fleece on a clean table or floor. Remove all heavy tags, stained wool, and obvious foreign matter. Roll the fleece in the following manner: 1) Begin at one side and loosely fold 8 to 10 inches of the edge toward the center of the fleece. 2) Do the same on the other side, but fold toward the center 2 times until the twice folded portion lies on top of the first fold. 3) Fold in the head wool. 4) Roll the entire fleece from the breech toward the shoulder and long side wool. Fleece SHOULD NOT contain belly wool. Place fleece in a clear, breathable plastic bag, one fleece per bag.

 Fleeces must be delivered to the Wool Barn no later than 5:00 PM, Monday, August 14. Fleeces will be released at 9:00 AM, Saturday, August 19.

- 3. Definition of color: "white is white; everything else is colored."
- 4. Fleeces must be skirted and should be very clean.
- For fleeces entered in the Blanketed class, the sheep must be covered with a protective blanket from shearing to shearing. Only the wool under cover is to be entered.
- Fleeces will be shown in clear plastic bags; tying fleece is optional.
- 7. Fleeces on display for sale must be entered and shown.
- Fleeces must be delivered to the Wool Barn Annex by 7:00 PM, Monday, August 12. Fleeces are to remain on display throughout the State Fair, provided space is available (may be released following the completion of judging if needed).
