

## 2024 Changes

Check here for a quick guide to the changes that have happened since the 2023 Wyoming State Fair. We will include major rule changes, new divisions and classes, and any classes that have been taken out.

### **GENERAL**

New order of premium book--check for updated page numbers throughout.

## YOUTH LIVESTOCK

- This year, Wyoming State Fair, with its Board of Directors, is pleased to announce that placements will be awarded for the TOP FIVE OVERALL, and the TOP FIVE IN EACH BREED for MARKET beef, swine, sheep, and goats.
- Livestock barns will be closed at night from curfew (10:30 PM) until 5:00 AM.
- Youth Horse exhibitors no longer need to qualify to enter and ride in performance classes at WSF. All youth horse classes are open to any bona fide, eligible Wyoming 4-H or FFA exhibitor who has exhibited in their respective and most recent county fair.
- Youth Sheep will use weight cards to declare weight. See Youth Sheep on page 45 for more info.
- Pygmy and Fiber Goats have been removed from the Youth Goat section. If there are any of these animals wishing to exhibit, they may be entered the appropriate age class in the breeding or meat goat divisions.
- Percentage Boer Bucks have been added to the Youth Breeding Meat Goat Show. See page 35.
- Starting in 2025, no horned goats will be allowed in the market classes. Please plan accordingly for next year's projects.

## **OPEN LIVESTOCK**

- All Open Beef departments except Maine Anjou will take entries via ShoWorks. All entry fees for Angus, Hereford, AORB, and Texas Longhorn will be sent to WSF. All shows (except Maine Anjou) will have an entry deadline of July 24th (via online or mail, postmarked). Most shows will accept late entries with an additional fee. See Open Beef department starting on page 81 for exact fees and late entry deadlines.
- The Performance Lamb contest is taking a hiatus for 2024 but will be back for 2025.

#### OPEN STATIC

- New Divisions! In Visual Arts: Al Assisted Art; in Crafted Arts: Diamond Painting; in Culinary: Sourdough Bread. See each department section for available classes, entry fees, and guidelines.
- In all Open Static Departments, "junior" classes have been renamed "youth" classes. See each department for age breakouts.
- •Needlework entries are due by SATURDAY, AUGUST 10, at 6 PM. Entries will be accepted at the Upper Ag Hall starting Friday, August 9 at 10 AM. Judging will happen on SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, and the exhibit will open on Tuesday with all other exhibit halls. No other static department will accept entries on Friday.

- New guidelines for the Hobby Collections division. See page 98 for more information.
- Needlework has added a class for non-judged (display only) Quilts of Valor. Please indicate if your Quilt of Valor is being entered in the judged class or the non-judged class.
- Edible Landscape entries (under Gardening) are now due by AUGUST 1 (end of day). The exhibitor and the landscape must reside in Wyoming. Photos must be submitted in JPEG or JPG format with attached written files for the descriptions, or as a PDF with written description included in the PDF file. Entries should be able to be easily printed and collated.
- Farm Toy Collection is no longer dually listed under Hobby Collections and Antique Machinery. It is only listed under Hobby Collections division in Crafted Arts.
- New guidelines for awarding individual and troop sweepstakes awards for Scouting. See page 100 for more information.
- Sheep Lead premiums have changed to more accurately reflect class divisions. See page 93 for the current premium schedules and awards.

### **EXHIBITOR OFFICE**

 New service times for the Exhibitor Office on Monday. ONLY FFAAdvisors/4-H Educators will be able to pick up credential on Monday from 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The office will then open for the general public. Tuesday - Friday will be open to all, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM as needed.

## 2024 ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Based on the September 2022 board directive, the WSF will defer to the Wyoming State Veterinarian (who is under the authority of the Wyoming Livestock Board) for guidelines on Certificates of Veterinary Inspections (CVI) and brand inspections. Exhibitors should be prepared to show ownership documentation upon request. Animals traveling from outside Wyoming are required to meet the rules for interstate travel. For further information, please refer to the Wyoming Livestock Board website, wlsb.state.wy.us/public, email lsbforms-applications@wyo.gov, or call 307.777.7515.

## **ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

A completed Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) listing individual animal official identification must accompany all livestock exhibiting at the Wyoming State Fair. The CVI must be issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry.

- Electronic CVIs will be accepted.
- Both electronic and paper CVIs must be readily available upon request.

  Wyoming Livestock Board (WLSB) veterinarians will be checking CVIs and potentially inspecting every animal.
- All livestock entering the grounds may be subject to inspection by WLSB veterinarians upon entry or throughout the fair.
- Animals with active ringworm lesions or warts easily visible without close examination are not permitted to exhibit.
- Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable disease may be immediately removed from the grounds and held in isolation until further testing is completed or released to the owner's premises.

## **BRAND INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS**

A brand inspection is required on all cattle, horses, mules, and sheep moving intrastate across a county line prior to entry. A brand inspection is also required on all cattle, horses, mules, and sheep leaving the Wyoming State Fair and Rodeo moving intrastate across a county line or interstate leaving the State of Wyoming. Documents need to be presented for inspection at time of animal health check-in.

## **WASTE REMOVAL PARTNERSHIP**

You and the Wyoming State Fair have the responsibility to have refuse disposed of in an appropriate manner.

All animal, feed, and bedding waste material from the State Fair goes to a recycling site to be composted. We need your assistance in the recycling efforts. Please keep your animal, feed, and bedding waste separated from your regular man-made garbage. It is the responsibility of each Exhibitor to keep stalls, pens, and/or exhibit areas clean and neat. In order to keep the barns in presentable order for guests, we ask the following of you:

- Have stalls cleaned and refuse material placed in the designated sites before 8:00 PM each evening.
- After 9:00 AM, all refuse is to be removed to the nearest designated refuse container

# Youth Shows

## YOUTH SHOWS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

ALPACA - CATTLE - GOATS - HORSES - POULTRY- RABBITS - SHEEP - SWINE Wool - FFA - 4-H

- 1. Wyoming State Fair Management reserves the right to interpret all rules and arbitrarily settle all differences and questions not adequately addressed in this guide.
- **2. Rules and Regulations.** Compliance with *General Rules and Regulations* apply. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to be familiar with all applicable rules and regulations. Read on page 9.
- 3. Health and Animal Welfare. All animals must meet Livestock Health and Welfare Requirements. Read on page 11.
- **4. Exhibitor Responsibility.** Wyoming State Fair will not be responsible for losses, injuries, or mishaps that may befall animals during the show. Reasonable precautions will be taken to prevent losses or injuries.
- 5. Exhibitor Eligibility. Bona fide Wyoming 4-H and Wyoming FFA members in good standing are eligible to enter and participate as a representative of their respective county 4-H program or FFA chapter. Youth must have exhibited/shown at their respective and most recent county fair.
  - **Separate 4-H and FFA Animal Entries.** Per the June 2021 MOU between UWE 4-H and the Wyoming FFA Association, any youth enrolled in both organizations must identify each static exhibit or animal entered for competition as being a unique outcome of their FFA SAE or their 4-H project and enter the correct classes/divisions endorsed by the applicable organization.
- 6. Entry Process. Entries are completed by the members' respective FFA Advisor or 4-H Educator. Read on page 9.
- 7. Ownership. All livestock must be owned by the individual member by the following dates:

Market Beef - February 1
Horses/Dogs - May 1
Market Lambs, Swine, Goats, Poultry - June 1
Meat Rabbits - 80-day rule
All Other Youth Livestock - June 1

- 8. Tagging/Identification. All MARKET animals shown must be properly tagged with an approved 15-digit RFID ear tag. Market animals not having the proper RFID tags in place will not be eligible to show. Tag must match tag recoreded at tagging by FFA/4-H/county and submitted by the tagging deadlines established (Beef- Feb 24, all other species- June 24).
- 9. All youth animal exhibits for beef, goats, swine, and sheep are required to remain on exhibit for the duration of fair. Animals must arrive by 5:00 PM on Monday prior to fair and will be released on Sunday starting at 8:00 AM following fair.
- 10. Youth Animal Fitting Policy: Exhibitors must be present for and actively participate in the fitting of their animals. In the interest of safety and education, an exhibitor may be assisted at the Wyoming State Fair in the fitting of their animal. Assistance is defined as a learning opportunity where the person doing the assisting is educating the youth exhibitor on the technique of ethical fitting as outlined within the premium book. Anyone found in violation of this rule may be subject to immediate disqualification or removal from the fairgrounds by State Fair Management. Unethical Fitting at the Wyoming State Fair is defined as: the injection, use, or administration of any drug that is prohibited by Federal, State, or Local Law, or any drug that is used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State or Local Law; the injection or internal or external administration of any product or material, whether gas, solid, or liquid, to an animal that conceals, enhances,

Internal or external administration of any product or material, whether gas, solid, or liquid, to an animal that conceals, enhances, or transforms the true conformation, configuration, breed, condition, or age, or by making the animal appear more sound than otherwise would appear; the administration, use, or application of any drug or feed additive affecting the central nervous system; the administration of diuretics for cosmetic purposes; tissue manipulation, removal, surgical attachment, or otherwise to change, conceal, enhance, or transform the true conformation or configuration of the animal; attaching to the hide foreign objects including hair/wool or hair/wool substitutes, cloth, or fiber; any physical or physiological attempt to alter the natural musculature or weight by use of injections or ingested material not conducive to the continued health or marketability of beef, sheep, swine, or goat carcasses. Maintaining the integrity of the meat derived from the livestock exhibited at the Wyoming State Fair is the primary reason for

Maintaining the integrity of the meat derived from the livestock exhibited at the Wyoming State Fair is the primary reason for the policies and procedures. Most of the market animals shown at the WSF were previously shown and sold before entry to the WSF. Exhibitors have a moral and ethical responsibility to produce meat that will be safe for the consuming public.

- 11. Stalling/Pens. All Youth show animals must be housed in the designated Youth section, unless given special written permission by the Youth Livestock Superintendent of the species in question, in cooperation and agreement with the applicable Open Show Superintendent.
- **12. Bedding.** There is no bedding provided. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding. Read page 11.
- 13. Livestock Trailers. No livestock trailers can be parked on the grounds without proper permits displayed on the trailer. Complimentary permits are provided to each FFA Advisor and 4-H Educator based on their number of WSF registered livestock exhibitors. See page 9.
- **14. Feed Delivery Vehicles.** Complimentary permits are provided to each FFA Advisor and 4-H Educator based on their number of WSF registered livestock exhibitors. See page 9.
- 15. Blocking Chutes, Trim Tables, Fitting Stands, and Fans. All livestock fans must be suspended. No fans attached to a cart or dolly. No butt fans. No fans in pedestrian walkways. Fans or equipment in use by exhibitors that is deemed to be obstructing safety or space, needed pen space, or facility operations will be requested to be removed by State Fair management. Safety guidelines, as set by the Wyoming State Fire Marshal, must prevail.
- 16. Judges/Judging. All judges' decisions are final. No person shall be permitted to judge a class in which he/she may be competing for an award or have ownership of any animal or article entered in such class. Judges are earnestly requested to familiarize themselves with the Rules & Regulations of this show. If any exhibitor interferes with the judges in the performance of their duties by letter, act, or otherwise, he/she shall be excused from competition and exhibition for such period as Management may determine and shall forfeit any awards received at this fair. Any person not an exhibitor who interferes with the judges in any manner during the performance of duties shall be asked to leave the judging arena.

**Unsportsmanlike Conduct.** Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated, and offending exhibitors may forfeit awards and premiums, be dismissed immediately from the fairgrounds, and/or lose future eligibility at the Wyoming State Fair. This is considered a violation of the *National Code of Show Ring Ethics*. Read pages 11-12.

- 17. Reporting Violations. Witnessed violations of the Youth Show Rules should be reported to an adult to then be addressed as follows:
  - To the FFA Advisor or 4-H Educator of the member whose entry is involved.
  - If the situation is not resolved, report to the state organizational leadership of the member. (State 4-H Coordinator or State FFA Advisor)
  - 3. If the situation is not resolved, report to a member of the WSF Youth Show Committee to review.
  - 4. If the situation might need legal attention, an appeal can be made through the WSF formal protest process only after steps 1-3 have been followed.
- 18. Protests. All formal protests from the Youth Livestock Show must be made by a current Youth Livestock Show exhibitor and must be submitted in writing, be signed by the Youth exhibitor(s), and be accompanied by \$100 cash or certified check (fee refunded if protest is sustained). The protest must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the State Fair Director immediately after the occasion for the protest. A protest pertaining to eligibility is most suitable when submitted prior to judging. No complaint or appeal that a judge overlooked an entry will be considered. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation. Depending on the basis of the protest, interested parties may be notified and given the opportunity to submit evidence. A decision may be withheld until a complete investigation can be made.
- **19. Suggestions/Comments.** Any person or group is encouraged to offer constructive comments and/or provide recommendations to improve the Wyoming State Fair Youth Livestock Show experience, to benefit all Wyoming youth show participants, at the present time and for the future. Comments may be made by visiting www.wystatefair.com.

## GENERAL YOUTH LIVESTOCK POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

- 1. All Youth livestock entries are to be made online via ShoWorks from the county level. Entry deadline is Friday, August 9, 2024 (11:59 PM) for youth horse show, and 6:00 PM, Saturday, August 10, 2024 for all other youth entries.
- 2. All Youth Show exhibitors must have medical release forms from their respective youth organization.
- 3. Each FFA or 4-H exhibitor in this department is required to pay a processing fee as a condition toward application for entry. Processing fees are established as follows: \$20.00 per head for beef cattle (breeding, market, feeder calf, and cow/calf pair); \$15.00 per equine (halter and performance); \$10.00 per head for all alpaca, sheep (breeding and market), swine (breeding and market), and all goats; \$3.00 per rabbit; \$3.00 per bird (poultry); and \$3.00 per wool fleece. This fee shall be paid for every animal registered for exhibit, even if said animal is not ultimately shown.

These fees are to be paid in full (or a club/school voucher submitted to WSF) by the deadline of 8:00 PM, Monday, August 12, 2024. If fees are not paid in full, the exhibitor(s) will either forfeit the right to compete in the 2024 Wyoming State Fair or must pay a late processing fee of \$50 per county and/or chapter to be accepted.

- 4. Based on the board directive in September of 2022, the WSF will defer to the State Vets for guidelines on CVIs and Brand Inspections. For information regarding Certificates of Veterinary Inspection and brand inspections, please refer to the State Vet guidelines available at https://wlsb.state.wy.us/public.
  - When a question arises concerning the health of any animal exhibited on the fairgrounds, the Show Superintendent shall consult with the State Fair Veterinarian and recommend an action to the Fair Management. Said animal may be dismissed or quarantined, if necessary.
    - All livestock brought to the Wyoming State Fair must be accompanied by a current brand inspection, when applicable.
- 5. NOTICE: Advisors and/or Agents making entry for the Youth Livestock Show are to figure animal head count/stall/pen needs accurately and properly, especially in the case where facilities have specified limits for space allowed per county and/or chapter. Those individual counties/chapters who exceed allocation shall be fined \$100.00 and the processing fees for the upcoming (next State Fair) year shall double (i.e., \$10.00 sheep fee goes to \$20.00) for all youth livestock shows. No exceptions. Honesty and integrity are the guide.
- 6. During official class judging, only the exhibitor will be allowed in the show ring. In case of exhibitor sickness or other emergency, an animal may be shown by a substitute exhibitor, providing the substitute is a bona fide Wyoming 4-H or FFA member, and the Show Superintendent grants permission in writing and is recorded in advance of the show for an animal class. In Showmanship Classes, exhibitors must show their own animal.
- 7. Youth exhibitors are encouraged to enter Open Class shows. Online entries close July 24th, but most shows will accept late entries. Please see each Open show for details on fees and deadlines. Youth sheep exhibitors must enter the Open Sheep Show by 6:00 PM Thursday, August 15. Please note registration paper requirements for Open Class Entries. Original registration papers, or photocopies thereof, must be presented for all animals entered in classes so requiring. Absolutely no "applied for" registrations will be accepted.
- 8. Wyoming State Fair Management encourages Youth Show exhibitors to wear 4-H or FFA emblems while exhibiting.
- In case the total department premiums exceed the established premium budget, premiums will be scaled down as designated by State Fair Management to meet budget.
   In the case where no donor is designated, there will be no special award presented.
- 10. If a Premier Exhibitor award is given, it is based upon total points won by an exhibitor in the division. First place ribbons count as 5 points, second place ribbons count for 3 points, and third place ribbons count for 1 point. All other placements are 0 points.
- 11. There will be no dogs allowed in the Livestock Barns. Please review the guidelines and policy for dogs in the front of this book.
- 12. Each Youth member having livestock for show is required to keep their display area clean and have the stalls orderly at all times. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of premiums and/or awards.
- 13. Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show, and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirments may forfeit awards/premiums from the show. Stall cards are to be completed and on display for the duration of the fair.



## ANIMAL DRUG TESTING

The Wyoming State Fair will continue drug testing Market Swine, Beef, Goats and Sheep. For these market species, drug testing will be mandatory for the top five placement winners and randomly selected market animals from each species



At the Wyoming State Fair we value education, animal welfare, protecting the food chain, and fostering fair competition. Drug testing is a valuable tool to help exhibitors and families to understand the possible implications of using substances on their animal.



By 5 PM on Tuesday (opening day) of the Wyoming State Fair, exhibitors must turn in a Quality Assurance Certificate and Statement of Disclosure (Drug Declaration) form for each animal to the Exhibitor Office drop box. These forms can be found at wystatefair.com or picked up at the Exhibitor Office.

## **GRANDS & RESERVES**

Sample collection will take place immediately following the judge's selection by Jordy Drug Testing, or a State Fair Representative, and a parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen for the exhibitor will escort the animal to the secured area and remain with the animal until a sample has been successfully collected, sealed and signed by Jordy Drug Testing and the exhibitor's adult representative (or the exhibitor if 18 or older). Chain of custody best practices shall be followed. Buckles will be presented ringside and used for photos, then held at the Wyoming State Fair office until the test results have come back negative or are deemed excusable by the review panel. Exhibitors will receive a letter informing them of the results of the test and, if negative or excusable, their buckles and premiums.

## RANDOM TESTS

Prior to animals entering the show ring, a class and placement will be announced that will be required to do a random drug test. Immediately after judging, Jordy Drug Testing, or a State Fair Representative, and a parent, guardian, or witness over the age of eighteen for the exhibitor will escort the animal to a secured area and remain with the animal until a sample has been successfully collected, sealed and signed by Jordy Drug Testing and the exhibitor's adult representative (or the exhibitor if 18 or older). Chain of custody best practices shall be followed. Exhibitors will receive a letter informing them of the results of the test and, if negative or excusable, their premiums.

## **CONSEQUENCES FOR POSITIVE TESTS**

Upon receiving a positive test result from Texas A&M, a review panel will determine whether the result is excusable, and if inexcusable, the consequences for the exhibitor. The determination made by the review panel is final and not eligible for protest.

In the event of a positive test, the Wyoming State Fair will notify the exhibitor of the positive test and of the opportunity to contest the results by (1) requesting a test of the split sample, (2) providing written explanation and supporting documents for why the animal had a positive drug test result, or (3) both. The selection of the laboratory, or choice of laboratories, to be used for the testing of any split samples shall be determined by the Wyoming State Fair. The exhibitor is solely responsible for all costs associated with the testing of their animal's split sample. If an exhibitor elects to contest, the exhibitor must, within 15 days of receiving notice of the positive test result: (1) submit a written request for a test of the split sample along with proof that the exhibitor has paid the selected laboratory all costs associated with the test; (2) submit written explanation and supporting documents, if any, for why the animal had a positive drug test result; or (3) both. If the exhibitor fails to do either of the above, within the time provided, the exhibitor waives any right to contest.

To determine whether the original results are inexcusable and if consequences are warranted, the review panel will review the original drug test results, the split sample test results, if applicable, and any documents submitted by the exhibitor. If the review panel deems the original positive test inexcusable, the exhibitor will foreit premiums and awards for the animal that tested positive.

Additionally, consequences for an inexcusable positive test may range from a 1-3 year probation period to a 1-3 year suspension period. During a probation period, the exhibitor's market livestock exhibits must be drug tested upon arrival at the Wyoming State Fairgrounds. The exhibitor will be responsible for drug testing fees during the probation period. During a suspension period, the exhibitor will not be permitted to show during the Wyoming State Fair.

In the case of a positive test resulting in disqualification, placements will not advance up.



## YOUTH HOUSING-DORMITORIES

To help youth exhibitors be able to attend the fair and participate in competetions, the fair provides the use of dormitory-style housing on grounds for the benefit of youth exhibitors.

#### **FACILITIES**

- The fair dormitories have bunk beds, foam mattresses, showers and lavatories. The female dormitory also has clothes racks.
- All youth and adult chaperones staying in the dormitories must provide their own bedding (sheets, pillows, pillow cases, and blankets), towels, soap, personal hygiene items, clothes hangers and any other personal belongings as needed.
- 3. Individuals are responsible for all personal belongings.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Only bona fide 4-H and FFA youth contestants who are participants in contests or educational activities during the State Fair, along with official adults serving as dormitory chaperones, are eligible to stay in youth housing.
- If space is available, Extension Educators, Agricultural Education (FFA) Advisors, and other designated chapter/county adult leaders may be allowed to stay in youth housing.
- 3. Children under eight years of age will not be allowed to stay in the dormitories.

## COSTS

- **1. Dormitory use fees are \$60.00 per full week** (Sunday through Sunday).
- 2. No single day rates will be available.
- 3. Each individual who stays in a dormitory is required to pay the \$60.00 usage fee.
- Dormitories will be available for occupancy on Sunday, August 11 at 3:00 PM and will close on Sunday, August 18 at 10:00 AM.

### REGISTRATION

- 1. Processes specific to each youth organization will be utilized.
  - For FFA DORMS, see pages 57-58, #8-12 and contact Stacy Broda.
  - b) For 4-H DORMS, see page 64, #2 and contact Mandy Marney or the State 4-H office.
- It is the responsibility of the FFA or 4-H personnel to verify the arrival of the youth members named on the housing registration.

## **PRIVILEGES**

- Youth having dormitory privileges are required to abide by established policies and cooperate with fair and dormitory management for the enjoyment and benefit of all involved.
- Advisors, agents, and adult chaperones are responsible and accountable for the conduct of their youth delegation as well as designated chaperones at all times.
- Individual or group violators of policies, deadlines, or other established guides for conduct will face disciplinary and/or legal action.
- For safety reasons: Each individual staying in the dormitory will be required to have proper identification easily visible at all times for access to the dormitories.

#### **PETS**

 There will be no pets or animals of any type allowed in the dormitories; exception for written requests for service dogs for those individuals with sight or hearing impairment.

### HOURS

- All youth and adults staying in the dorm shall be in by 10:30 PM each evening or at the designated curfew time as posted by the Wyoming State Fair and the youth programs involved.
- 2. Adult chaperones are responsible to ensure that each and all members of their delegation are in prior to the evening deadline.
- 3. Violations of the established curfew time will cause the individual violator to automatically lose their dormitory use and other fairtime privileges for the current fair. The violator will be required to find alternative housing off the fairgrounds, or will be requested to leave the fairgrounds for the duration of the current fair, or will have parents called to pick them up the following morning to be taken home for the duration of the current fair.

### **FORBIDDEN**

- 1. Possession or use of alcohol or illegal substances on grounds is absolutely forbidden. Any youth participant, exhibitor, or adult chaperone identified with such substances shall automatically lose the privilege and earned right to represent their FFA Chapter or County 4-H program at State Fair and will immediately be sent home. There will be zero tolerance for alcohol or illegal substance use while involved with the Wyoming State Fair and/or being in the dormitories or on the fairgrounds. Legal action may be pursued for violations.
- There shall be no tobacco use inside the dormitories at any time. Violators will be warned the first time, with a second violation resulting in automatic loss of dormitory use.

#### MEDICAL

- Each youth participant and designated adult chaperone is covered by accident and health insurance by their individual youth organization.
- 2. Individuals requiring medical assistance are required to contact the head chaperone of the dormitory or contact the administrative office of the participant youth organization: Fort Caspar for 4-H and Fort Laramie for FFA

## RESPONSIBILITY

 The Wyoming State Fair assumes no responsibility for the loss of property, accident, or illness from utilizing dormitory space at the State Fair.

## DORMITORY PARKING

## **COMPLIMENTARY PARKING**

1. The Wyoming State Fair provides complimentary parking passes to one designated AEI or CEA from each participating chapter and county. The number of individual vehicle parking passes provided is based upon the number of registered exhibitors/contestants staying in the dormitories from each chapter or county delegation. Delegations having passenger buses will be provided one complimentary parking pass per bus.

2. Vehicles not having the proper parking credentials (designated pass) properly displayed or not properly parked in the designated lot may cause the vehicle pass to be revoked. Please use the parking passes in the proper manner and only in the designated locations. Abuse of these complimentary parking credentials may lead to negative consequences resulting in payment for the parking credential.



## FEED AND BEDDING/EQUIPMENT TRAILERS

- There are to be no trailers parked on grounds (inside fenced areas) for 2024. The State Fair will designate allocated space for youth livestock support trailers.
- 2. The trailers are to have a current permit displayed on the trailer for ease of visibility.
- Complimentary trailer permits and feed delivery vehicle passes will be provided to one designated AEI or CEA for each chapter and/or county. The number of permits provided being based on the number of registered youth livestock exhibitors from each chapter and/or county.
- 4. Additional feed delivery vehicle passes may be purchased for \$60.00 each by the designated AEI or CEA.
- Feed delivery vehicles may only be used during the designated hours of 5:00 AM to 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM. Violators will lose their feed delivery permit(s).
- 6. Trailers not having the proper permit displayed or not parked in the proper location will be notified and all county or chapter premiums will be withheld until proper corrections are taken in a timely manner. Chapters or counties not abiding by the designated allocation of permit spaces will automatically forfeit their feed trailer allocation space(s) for the next year.
- All other livestock trucks and trailers are to be parked in the south end of the Pepsi Lot, west of Brownfield Road. (There are to be no livestock trailers parked in other locations on the grounds.)



- A processing fee of \$20.00 per animal entered is to be paid at the time of making entry.
- All cattle exhibited in the Youth Beef Show must be recorded as a 4-H or FFA project and be designated to represent the member's respective county or chapter. All exhibitors are directly accountable to their Extension Agents and 4-H Leaders and/or Ag Education Instructors and FFAAdvisors.
- Any beef animal inadvertently entered in the wrong class may be assigned to the correct class. Animals that do not fit into established classes will not be allowed to show.
- All Youth Show beef cattle will be stalled in the assigned stalls and assigned tie-outs only. All stalls, or any change in stalling, must be approved by the Youth Beef Superintendent.
- No breeding cattle will be shown without birth dates supplied to WSF.
- 7. Any violation of the following policies will result in immediate disqualification of the exhibitor from the Youth Beef Show. Further forfeiture of awards, future privileges and disciplinary action may be taken.
  - a) No use of any artificial tail head, tail fin, artificial poll, or adding any hair or hair-like substance.
  - b) No showing of livestock of any ineligible age or showing unethically fitted livestock. Unethical fitting is deemed to consist of any method which alters the natural conformation of any part of the animal's body, or any animal having been operated on or tampered with for the purpose of concealing faults or with the intent to deceive.

- 8. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation. The use of false tail heads or adding hair, or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited. The dyeing, or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and/or color is prohibited.
- 9. Fitting chutes/stands inside the barn must be in designated areas as determined by the Open/Youth Beef Superintendents. Trim stands/fitting chutes will only be allowed to be left standing in designated areas. Each county and/or chapter is allowed to bring on grounds only one chute/stand per three (3) head of cattle stalled in the beef barns.
- Unfitted is defined as no compounds used on hair, hooves, or skin. Clean, dry, combed hair is acceptable.
- 11. Classifying the Market Beef at the State Fair does NOT mandate similar procedures at County Fairs. Showing cattle by height is advantageous only when sufficient numbers are available to ensure some uniformity. County Fairs may be best served by classifications based on weight or a combination of both hip height and weight.
- 12. Cattle are required to be stalled in the barn from 8:00 A.M. until 7:00 P.M. each day. ALL TIE-OUTS MUST BE IN THE BARN BY 8:00 A.M. AND REMAIN IN THE ASSIGNED STALLS UNTIL 7:00 P.M. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. VIOLATIONS OF THESE TIMES WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF YOUTH BEEF SHOW PREMIUMS. NO PANELS IN TIE-OUTS.
- All Youth Beef cattle entering Open Class Shows must submit entries and pay all applicable fees for those shows. WSF encourages youth to participate in Open Class Shows.
- 14. Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirments may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.

- Breed Association registration papers are not required, but are recommended for youth breeding cattle. All entries should be phenotypic of the breed class entered and be of high quality.
- 2. The Youth Show Committee has full and final authority to designate the most appropriate class for each individual breeding exhibit. NOTE: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to present a crossbred or questionable animal to the Youth Show Committee for a visual appraisal and decision 48 hours BEFORE the day of the show. Unapproved animals, untypical of the class entered, may be dismissed from the ring, the exhibitor disqualified, all privileges forfeited, and may require additional disciplinary action to be taken.
- 3. Bulls should be shown with nose lead.
- 4. Youth Breeding Beef classes will be posted by Superintendent and exhibitors need to confirm entries.
- 5. Show Management may combine or divide designated classes at their discretion for the best exhibition. If seven (7) or more females from one specific breed arrive on grounds and are processed, a separate breed show will be provided for. No special classes, or classes beyond the ages given, will be added.
- 6. ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS: The Class code must include the Division Number and Class Number. EXAMPLE: If you are entering Black Angus in Class No. 4; your class entry would be: 1601 for Youth Breeding Beef Division; and class 4 for Black Angus Spring yearling heifer, calved between Mar. 1 & April 30, 2022.)

  - a) 10:00-10:30 AM ......Breed steers/heifers
  - b) 10:30 AM......Market steers/heifers by breed.
- Each animal is allowed only one trip through the scale. The Weigh-in Committee will have full authority to operate the scale and record the weight. No weigh backs will be allowed
- Classes will be established by breed and then weight within each breed division respectively following processing. Champions and Reserve Champions from each of the breed divisions will compete for Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Market Beef.

## 1. A processing fee of \$10.00 per animal is to be paid at the time of making entry.

- All Market Goat exhibitors must verify their entries with the Show Superintendent and Coordinator during check-In upon arrival at the show ring and before unloading.
- Exhibitors are to read and abide by Animal Health requirements for goats. All market goats must have USDA/APHIS Scrapie identifications tags in place prior to arrival.
- 4. Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8 inch of hair or less at the time of arrival on the fairgrounds. Legs may have hair up to the hock and knee only. Slick shorn goats are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/airbrushing, or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification.
- Market goats may be wethers or non-bred does. Market goats
  are to have milk teeth in place or may have lost one or
  both of their milk teeth, but there shall be no evidence of
  breaking skin or eruption of the two permanent front teeth.
- Market goats must weigh a minimum of 50 pounds, with no set upper weight limit. Underweight market goats will not be allowed to show. Goats need to be of a marketable weight and size. Market goats will be weighed one time; no weigh-backs will be allowed.
- All market goats will be checked for properly placed Wyoming State Fair-designated ear tags and/or tattoos at processing.
- 8. Exhibitors are allowed to use halters or collars when showing their market goat.
- Classes will be established by natural or logical weight breaks, by the Show Superintendent following the weighin/processing time on Tuesday, August 13 at 8:00 AM.
- Champion and Reserve Champion winners in each class will return to the show ring to compete for Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Goat.
- 11. The Wyoming State Fair does not condone excessive bracing, slapping, or lifting the legs of market goats in the show ring or while on grounds. The slapping or lifting of Market Goats in the show ring is not allowed. All goats must have four feet on the ground during the judge's inspection or handling. Lifting feet off the ground or placing feet on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. Exhibitors will receive one warning if they are found lifting or slapping goats. Second offense will result in automatic exhibitor and animal disqualification.

- This class must be entered in county or chapter name via ShoWorks by 6:00 PM Saturday night prior to start of fair; no entry fee if entered by this time. Those not entered prior to the deadline must pay a ten dollar (\$10.00) late fee. Premiums will be paid in the county or chapter name under which entered.
- No more than one FFA and one 4-H Pen per county may compete. However, FFA and 4-H exhibitors from within a county may choose to join together and enter one pen of five.
- 3. If two pens are entered from a county area, the Extension Agent may select the 4-H pen from those members chosen to represent that county with market goats at State Fair and the FFA advisors from chapters within that county may select the FFA pen from any or all of their respective chapter members who were chosen to exhibit market goats at State Fair. All goats must have been shown in their respective County Fair, selected to represent that county, and show in the appropriate class at State Fair.
- Wethers and/or market does may be selected to make up a pen, but exactly five head must be shown and owned by at least three different youth exhibitors.
- Each pen of five will be allowed two additional handlers to help set up and exhibit the pen. All exhibitors must be Youth Goat exhibitors and represent the respective chapter or county in the pen being shown.
- Pens to be judged on overall appearance, uniformity, and market goat quality; showmanship, appearance, and attitude of exhibitors will also be considered.

- The exhibitor and parent code of conduct will be observed and enforced. It can be found in the General Rules section at the begining of this book.
- 3. A processing fee of \$15.00 per head per division is to be paid at the time the entry is made.
- 4. All classes are determined by the exhibitor's age. Whether 4-H or FFA members, you should enter the appropriate age division class. Age divisions are: Juniors 8-10 years old, Intermediates 11-13 years old, Seniors 14-18 years old.
- 5. Youth exhibitors pay no stall charges. Stalls will be available Sunday at 9 AM.
- 6. Stall assignments will be made upon arrival at the stall building at the south end of the Pepsi Equine Center. To be stalled together, you must arrive together. Exhibitors who do not clean their stalls at the end of the show will be subject to a stall cleaning charge of \$20. Stalls are to be vacated by the end of the show on Tuesday (unless prior arrangements have been made in writing and confirmed with the stalling office). Failure to clean stalls will result in forfeiture of premium earnings. Check out must be done with the stall office, not the horse show office.
- Stall office hours will be 7AM to 7 PM daily starting the Sunday, prior to the opening of Fair.
- 8. Youth show exhibitors are to check in with the horse show office, at the north end of Pepsi Center to receive contestant number and pattern book. Horse show office hours are Sunday 3:30 PM 5:00 PM, Monday and Tuesday 7:00 AM to end of show.
- 9. No exhibitor may enter more than one horse in any class that may require rail work.
- Mixed teams (4H & FFA) will be allowed in Team Roping, provided that the team was entered properly in advance. Each team must enter as a team, and each team member must be from the same county.
- 11. Mixed teams (4H & FFA) may also enter Ranch Sorting.

  They must enter as a team and be from the same county.
- 12. All 4-H and FFA equines entered must be the same as recorded by the 4-H or FFA member in his/her project.
- 13. NO STALLIONS are allowed in the Youth Horse Show.
- 14. Safe horsemanship guidelines must be followed at all times during the Youth Horse Show to protect exhibitors and spectators. Unsafe practices will be prohibited (i.e. riding double, riding bareback, riding with halters, riding at a speed greater than a walk outside of an arena). All animals must be under control at all times during the Youth Show. Unruly animals may be excused.
- 15. In the interest of safety, a parent, leader, or advisor may help check or change tack, hold the horse, saddle, bridle, or halter the horse prior to the member entering the arena.
- 16. The American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) rulebook will be used to determine appropriate course of action for all performance and showmanship classes. Barrel Racing, Pole Bending, Goat Tying, Team Roping and Breakaway Roping will use National High School Rodeo Association (NHSRA) Rules. The judge's interpretation of any rule or guideline is final. This competition is not sponsored by Wyoming 4-H or FFA and any inquiries about rules, enforcement, awards, or processes should be directed to the Wyoming State Fair staff and show superintendents.
- 17. Judges will provide all other patterns and may choose from any resource. Pattern selections will not be announced in advance of State Fair. QR codes linking to the patterns will be posted at the horse show office.
- 18. Contestants will be denied entry into a class if they are not present for the last call into the ring. At judge's discretion, performance classes that exceed 20 exhibitors may be randomly divided into smaller groups and the top contestants from each group will be brought back for the final placing. No premiums provided for split classes - only final placings.

- If an animal is shown in a Fur Class, it must also have been shown in its respective Breed Class. Animals disqualified for reasons other than health may still show in the Fur Class. Fryer fur animals should be shown out of a meat pen only.
- Instruction sheet and comment card(s) will be handed out during check-in starting at 8:00 AM. Complete comment

- card per instructions and be sure to put rabbit's class number in the upper right corner of comment card.
- 8. Rabbit identification sometimes slows down the show. To speed up that process, exhibitors are asked to have all rabbits tattooed in the left ear. Please record tattoo number on the coop card. Valid entries from the county or chapter should include the computer entry plus a coop card.
- Wyoming State Fair encourages Youth Show exhibitors to wear 4-H or FFA emblems. These emblems may be on any long-sleeved garment. That garment cannot contain ARBA or individual rabbitry names or emblems.
- 10. There are four separate showmanship contests for rabbits: FFA Showmanship • Senior 4-H Showmanship • Intermediate 4-H Showmanship • Junior 4-H Showmanship. There will be no premiums paid for Rabbit Showmanship classes.
- Herdsmanship is an important component of the youth show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirements may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.
- Current classes and varieties are the result of trends over the years. Additions and deletions are made each year based upon the trends shown by coop card numbers.,
- 13. ENTRY INFORMATION: The Class Code must include the Division number and Class number. EXAMPLE: If you are entering a Californian Senior Buck, your class entry would be 1618-6 (1618 for Youth Rabbit Show division; and 6 for Californian Senior Buck class.

- Rules and Regulations: General Youth Livestock Policies and Procedures apply to this division as well as those rules listed below and in each show section.
- The Superintendent/Coordinator has jurisdiction regarding pen/stall assignments. As a guideline, sheep shall be penned two per stall. Exceptions will be yearling rams or larger breeds, if determined necessary. Please note siblings may be penned together if necessary.
- 3. Extreme docking of lambs is not an acceptable animal husbandry practice; refer to General Information, Exhibits and Exhibitors Section, rule #33. Any sheep showing signs of rectal prolapse shall be disqualified and must be immediately removed from the fairgrounds by the exhibitor.
- 4. Ewe lambs entered, processed, and shown as breeding animals may not be exhibited as market animals. Ewe lambs entered, processed, and shown as market animals may not be exhibited as breeding animals. The only exception is that Champion of Champions (CoC) exhibits that won Grand Champion Market Lamb at their county fair may be shown in both the CoC show and EITHER the breeding show or market show (but not both) at WSF. WSF market tags <u>must be</u> removed from all breeding ewe lambs.
- Any sheep inadvertently entered into the wrong class may be assigned by show staff to the correct class.
- Wood shavings will not be provided for sheep pens. Wood shavings are available for purchase, through the Show

- Management at designated locations from 7:00-9:00 AM and 6:00-8:00 PM daily. Straw may be used as bedding if provided by the exhibitor.
- 7. Unauthorized Animals: Only sheep officially entered will be allowed on show grounds. Any sheep brought onto the grounds which is NOT entered for competition or exhibition will be removed from the fairgrounds.
- 8. All sheep must have USDA Scrapie Tags in place.
- Any exhibitor or anyone assisting an exhibitor shall not aggressively or loudly "pop, slap, hit, or strike" their animal at anytime during the show or any place on the fairground's property.
- Lifting the sheep in a fluid motion to set the front legs prior to quickly setting the feet back on the ground is acceptable.
- Placing feet on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. All sheep must have four feet on the ground during Judge's inspection.
- 12. All sheep must have clean water available to drink in pens at all times.
- Only one trimming stand allowed per exhibitor. No lamb sale racks, supplement carts, extra feed, or bedding shall be stored in stalling area.
- 14. All livestock fans must be mounted at least five (5) feet high on stationary mounts. No fans in pedestrian walkways. No extension cords strung across alleyways. Fans or equipment in use by exhibitors that is deemed to be obstructing safety or space, needed pen space, or facility operations will be requested to be removed by State Fair Management.
- All tack of exhibitors will be confined to designated areas by the show superintendent/coordinator and only if pen space allows.
- Stall cards are to be completed and on display for the duration of the fair.
- 17. Herdsmanship is an important componet of the Youth Show and youth groups not meeting minimal daily herdsmanship requirements may forfeit awards/premiums from the show.

- 1. Breeding sheep in breed classes must be registered. Every animal entered as purebred (registered) must have a registration paper issued by the respective breed association. Registered animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name, exhibitor's immediate family name or exhibitor's farm name, or FFA chapter name, and must be done so prior to ownership deadline. A duplicate of the original breed certificate must be presented to the Show Superintendent/Coordinator and on file by Tuesday of fair week at 9:00 AM. No "applied for registration" allowed. Tattoos, ear tags, or other identification marks must match registration certificates.
- 2. Commercial Classes: Sheep in Breed D and N (Commercial Crossbred Wool Type and Commercial Crossbred Wether Type) are not required to be purebred or registered, but must be individually identified by scrapie tag number on a bill of sale/brand inspection that proves ownership prior to ownership date. A duplicate of ownership papers is to be presented to the Show Superintendent/Coordinator and on file by Tuesday of fair week at 9:00 AM. All sheep not registered will show in these classes. Due to the absence of breed certificate, Commercial Crossbred Wether Type ewe lambs will show by weight.
- 3. Slick Shorn vs Fitted: Slick Shorn shall be defined as having been shorn within 10 days of processing. The presence or absence of head wool on shorn lambs will follow National Breed Standards. Exhibitors are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/airbrushing, or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the Slick Shorn animal. Fitted Sheep shall be defined as having at least 1" of wool on the majority of the body. Fitted sheep shall be exhibited according to National Breed Standards that apply to the fitting of that breed. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification.

The following breeds will have an option of showing in a Slick Shorn class or a Fitted With Fleece class:

- a) Dorset
- b) Hampshire
- c) Suffolk
- d) AOB Meat
- e) Commercial Crossbred Wether Type

The following breeds will be shown as Fitted With Fleece. No Slick Shorn exhibits in these breeds allowed.

- a) Columbia
- b) Targhee
- c) AOB Wool
- d) Commercial Crossbred Wool Type
- 4. Fitted sheep will be housed in the Open Sheep barn. If an exhibitor has both Fitted and Slick Shorn sheep, they may house them together in the Open Sheep barn; however, exhibitors with only Slick Shorn sheep will be house in the Youth Sheep Barn.
- 5. All ewe/ram lambs must still have their lamb teeth with no exposure of yearling teeth. If a lamb has lost a temporary incisor or has visible signs of permanent incisors, the lamb will be placed in the yearling class. Lambs are subject to being mouthed at the discretion of the show management at any time.
- 6. A Breeder's Flock shall consist of one eligible age ram, 2 yearling ewes, and 2 ewe lambs. Best Four Lambs shall consist of four lambs of either sex. All animals in a breeding group class must be owned by one individual and shown in either 4-H or FFA, but not both.

- Should 25 head or more be entered in any class, the class will be randomly split into two subclasses for elimination judging. No premiums will be paid for subclasses.
- 8. Youth show exhibitors are encouraged to enter the Open Sheep Show with enteries and fees due by 6:00 PM, Thursday, August 15 at the Open Sheep Show Office. No late entries will be accepted.
- ENTRY INFORMATION: The Class Code must include the Division number and Class number. EXAMPLE: If you are entering a Dorset Ram Fitted lambed in January of 2024, your class entry would be: 1619 - 59 (1619 for Youth Breeding Sheep; class 59 for Dorset Ram Fitted Lamb, born Jan 1-Feb 15, 2024.)

### **POLICIES**

- A processing fee of \$10.00 per animal is to be paid at the time of entry.
- 2. Lambs entered in this division may be either wethers or ewes.
- 3. All market lambs must not show any signs of active club lamb fungus.
- 4. All market lambs must be totally and uniformly slick shorn a maximum of 10 days prior to classification/processing and should be shorn according to breed standards. Exhibitors are not permitted to use artificial coloring, paint/powder/ airbrushing or any foreign substance to cosmetically alter the natural color pattern of the Slick Shorn animal. Unethical fitting practices will result in disqualification.
- 5. All slick shorn sheep will be housed in the Youth Sheep Barn. No exceptions.
- Classes will be established by breed class and then weight within each breed class respectively by the Sheep Superintendent following weight card turn in, using natural breaks or logical separations. Breed classes with nine (9) or less total entries will be combined with the Any Other Registered Breed.
- Champions and Reserve Champions from each of the breeds and crossbreds will compete for Overall Grand and Reserve Champion Market Lamb.
- 8. Weigh-In: There will be no official weigh-in of market lambs. Each exhibitor will be responsible for declaring his/her animal's weight via a weight card\* to be turned in to the Sheep Superintendent no later than Tuesday, August 13, 2024, at 1:00 PM. (\*Weight card-scale card to record: name, animal tag number, class and declared weight. A scale will be available to verify animal weight.)
- **9. Weigh-Back:** There will be a weigh-back in class of the top five market sheep with a 5% variance allowed.
- 10. Weight range for market lambs will be: Minimum 100 pounds. Any sheep underweight will not be allowed to show.
- 11. Each lamb is allowed only one trip through for breed verification and processing.

- 3. Exhibitors may enter two (2) fleeces in any one class, and entries may be made in as many classes as desired. An individual fleece may be entered in one class only. Any fleece entered in both the Youth and Open Shows must be entered in the same class with the same name.
- 4. <u>ELIGIBILITY OF FLEECES</u>: Each fleece entered must have been grown by a Wyoming 4-H or FFA member and be from sheep recognized as part of current project work and have been shorn in 2023 or 2024. Fleeces shown at the 2023 Fair are not eligible for the 2024 Wyoming State Fair. Each fleece must represent not more than 12 months growth, except in the case of yearling fleeces, where 16 months growth will be allowed.
- 5. <u>FLEECE QUALITY:</u> Any fleece entered in competition shall be discriminated against if: (a) tied with anything but paper twine; (b) showing any paint or tar brands (soluble branding fluids permissible); (c) showing excessive dung locks or tags; (d) discolored by excessive moisture; (e) cotted; (f) showing a weak staple or break in fiber; or (g) containing any excess burrs or other vegetable matter. Fleeces showing black fibers will be disqualified.

- 6. PREPARATION OF FLEECES: Fleeces need not be tied but must be prepared in the same fashion. Spread out the fleece on a clean table or floor, skin-side down, taking care not to pull or open fleece as it is handled. The fleece will look like a pelt or hide. At this stage, before rolling or tying, remove all heavy tags, stained wool, and obvious foreign matter. Rolling the fleece takes four easy steps: (1) Begin at one side and loosely fold 8 to 10 inches of the edge toward the center of the fleece. (2) Do the same on the other side, but fold toward the center two times until the twice-folded portion lies on top of the first fold. (3) Fold in the head wool. (4) Roll the entire fleece from the breech toward the shoulder and long side wool. Fleece SHOULD NOT contain belly wool. Place fleece in a clear, breathable plastic bag.
- Fleeces must be delivered to the Wool Barn no later than 5:00 PM, Monday, August 12.
- 8. Fleeces will be released starting at 9:00 PM, Saturday, August 17.

**The Wyoming Wool Initiative** will award a belt buckle to the Premier Youth Wool Exhibitor.



The wool produced from sheep varies from very fine to extremely coarse and from 1 inch to 12 inches in length for a growing period of 12 months. For yarn to be uniform, the wool from which it is made must be uniform, particularly as to length and fineness. This wide variation in the wool produced, plus the need for uniform fiber, gives a basis for present-day grades of wool. These grades are arbitrary divisions made primarily according to fineness and length. Other priorities include soundness, purity, character, color and condition.

A wool grader considers all these points. Clean wool content, fineness, length of staple and strength are the main characteristics considered in arriving at the value of wool.
