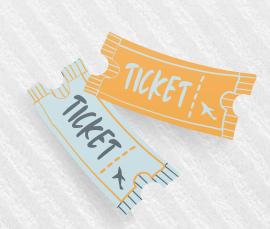

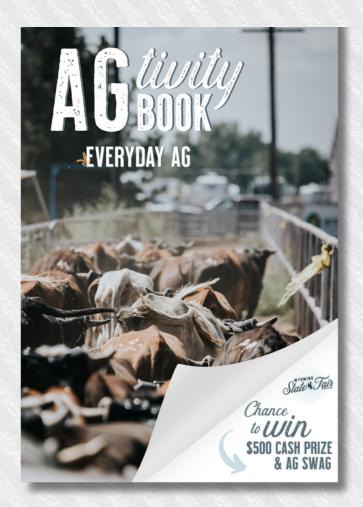

The AGtivity book contains a variety of activities including a Judge with the Judge activity, word search, animal matching, by-product identifying activity and Scavenger Hunt. The AGtivity Book engages participants in livestock judging alongside industry experts with a Judge with the Judge activity. Visitors can explore the fairgrounds through an exciting Scavenger Hunt, collecting "brands" from each barn and exhibit hall, while learning fascinating agriculture facts along the way.

AGTIVITY BOOK - AG EVERYWHERE

WHAT A JUDGE MIGHT LOOK FOR IN SWINE:

- A lean hog that has a little fat.
- Hams (rear legs) that are long, deep and full.
- Muscular shoulders and a large, lean loin (back)
 Good width between the front legs to allow for ample chest capacity

WHAT A JUDGE WILL LOOK FOR IN THE SHOW RING:

- Showmanship includes general appearance, especially cleanliness of the animal and the exhibitors ability to control and maneuver the swine throughout the show ring.
- The exhibitor turns and moves the pig by tapping the shoulder or under the jaw with a variety of tools called whip, pipe, and cane.
- · Alert showman will mist their hogs with water to keep them cool and will brush off any dirt that may get on the hog.
- A great showman will be alert and courteous to other exhibitors and pay attention to both the animals and the judge at all times.

SWINE TERMINOLOGY

- Sow: a female pig that has had piglets
- Gilt: a young female pig that has yet to farrow
- · Boar: a male pig used for breeding
- Barrow: a castrated male pig that can't breed
- Nursery: a facility or building designed to house newly weaned pigs that are 3 weeks old until 8-10 weeks of age. Nursery pigs weigh around 40 pounds when they leave.
- Finishing: after nursery, the pigs move on to the finishing phase before market. The pigs are raised in a finishing barn until 20-24 weeks of age when they have reached market weight, about 240-270 pounds
- Litter: baby pigs born to a sow at one time
- Farrowing: the process of a sow giving birth to piglets.
- Gestation: the period when a sow is pregnant, which is about 3 months, 3 weeks and 3 days.
- Piglets: baby pigs up to weaning age, which is typically three weeks of age
